WLB Releases Voluntary Wage Boost Appeals

CLEVELAND, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Some 1,600 voluntary wage increase applications from Ohio, West Virginia and Kentucky have been released as a result of President Truman's relaxation of wage controls to speed recovery.

Chairman Frederick H. Bullen of the Regional War Labor Board, announced today.

Bullen said the biggest single factor in the recently-announced executive program initiating the return to a peacetime economy was the release of 16,000 such wage applications throughout the country.

"It takes but little test of the imagination to visualize how the elimination of the controls involved in those 16,000 cases will speed direct negotiations in the reconversion period," declared the regional chairman.

In forecasting swift return of pre-war effectiveness to collective bargaining in employer-employee relations, Bullen asserted the national board has announced a streamlined program for handling some 3,000 dispute cases, 370 in the region.

"As soon as the regional board can adapt the national board program to the various types of cases before it, streamlined methods will be applied to those cases in our own area," continued Bullen.

Nevius' Disbarment Proceedings Opened

SPRINGFIELD, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Common Pleas Judge Golden C. Davis Saturday appointed three Springfield attorneys to institute disbarment proceedings against Jerome A. Nevius, 34, former Clark-co prosecutor convicted of bribery in connection with operation of a gambling club.

The attorneys are George S. Raup, W. Y. Mahar and William M. Elder.

A grievance committee of the Clark-co Bar-as-n filed a complaint last May 25 accusing Nevius of unprofessional conduct in office.

35 Are Killed In Bolivian Wreck

COCHABAMBA, Bolivia, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Thirty-five persons were killed and 53 injured today in a train derailment near this Central Bolivian city.

The original count of 18 dead and 47 injured increased as workers removed debris. The injured who could be moved were taken to Punata hospital which had sent doctors and drugs.
