

New Film Supplies Fast Trip To Gay, Fictitious Heaven

A humorous journey into heaven provides a bright, fantastic twist to "That's the Spirit," a superlatively entertaining musical drama which opens Tuesday at the Sigma theatre.

Jack Oakie and Peggy Ryan, the gay father and daughter of the recent "Merry, Monahans," bear a similar relationship in this new picture. The two screen favorites are co-starring at the head of an unusually competent cast. Beginning in the 90's, the ingenious story follows most of its characters thru a score of years. Oakie is seen as a vaudeville magician and June Vincent has the role of a sheltered young lady who marries the performer against her father's wishes. What ensues is your conveyance to a good time.

Portraying psychopathic killers on the screen is a specialty of Dan Duray, altho in real life he is a mild mannered lad with an engaging smile and a happy family life. One of his most sinister roles to date is the vindictive and suspicious outlaw in "Along Came Jones," in which he is currently appearing with Gary Cooper and Loretta Young, now at the Ohio theatre.

No matter how "grown-up" we look, we all remain kids at heart, as witness the huge success of the moving picture fairy tale of the past and the present. Actually, it has never been more popular than today. Movie screens across the nation are or soon will be playing new ones. One of the most current tales of fantasy to be played in the fair city of Lima is "A Thousand and One Nights" now at the Quilna theatre, starring Cornel Wilde, Evelyn Keyes, Phil Silvers and Adele Jergens.

Two doctors, pitting their skill against the ravages of war form the basis of "China Sky," the current feature at the State theatre. The film, which stars Randolph Scott, Ruth Warrick and Ellen Drew, tells of one woman's selfishness and another's high courage and generosity.

That man was John Dillinger—long to be remembered by Lima folks because of his escape from the Al-ten-co jail. A film has been made of his life and will open Wednesday at the Lyric theatre.

Tank Commander Freed From Japs

FREMONT, Aug. 28—(UP)—Mr. and Mrs. James T. Weaver, Fremont, were notified today that their son, Brig. Gen. James R. N. Weaver, 57, had been released from the custody of the Japanese. He is believed to have been with Gen. Jonathan Wainwright at San, Manchuria, 100 miles from Mukden. The news received here did not state the condition of Gen. Weaver's health.

Weaver commanded the famed tank outfit which fell to the Japs on Bataan. Word of his release was sent by the War department to the general's wife in Columbus, Ga. She notified his parents. The general's only son, Lt. Col. James R. Weaver, was in the Okinawa fight. His father, Gen. Simon B. Buckner's staff and was wounded the day before Buckner was killed.
