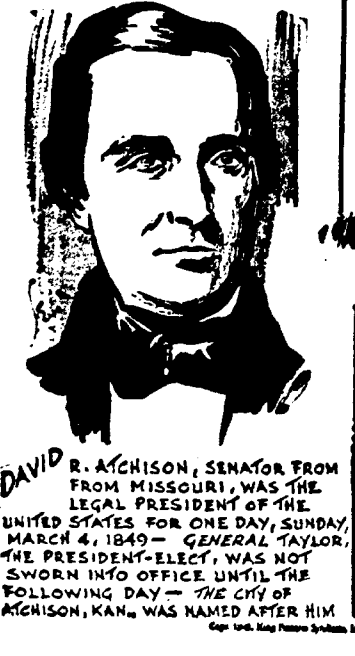

70,000 to Sail for Home Soon

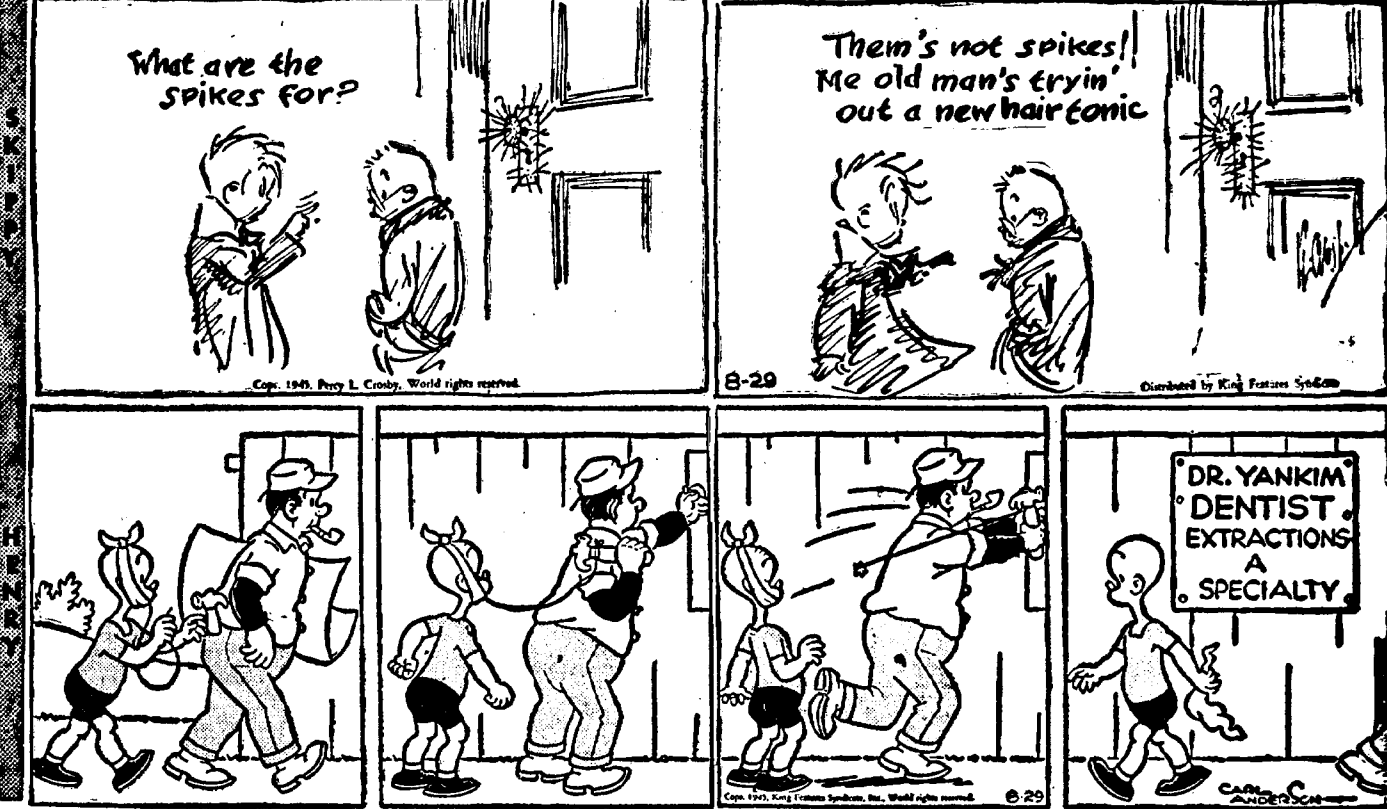
GIs Leave Marseille Early in September
 PARIS (AP)—From 70,000 to 80,000 American troops are scheduled to sail from Marseille to the United States during the first two weeks of September, mostly high-scoring soldiers ready for discharge, it was announced Tuesday.
 Other units previously scheduled for redeployment to the Pacific or service in the United States and which are now standing by in the Delta base staging areas around Marseilles, also will be embarked for home whenever there are not sufficient high-scoring troops on hand to fill the available ships.
 The transports operating from Marseilles include the West Point, Wakefield, Mount Vernon, Manhattan, and Washington. In addition, service troops also will be flown home in September at the rate of more than 200 daily.
 The redeployment schedule for other American troops in the European staging areas follows:
 The 1st Infantry, Main body arrived in United Kingdom for re-shipment to the United States; 137th regiment en route to the United States from Le Havre.
 Fourth infantry: 179th and 180th regiments began shuttling to England for transport to New Guinea, English and social studies for 7 and 8; Mrs. Eleanor Nerdrum, music, and Mrs. Margaret Fleury, secretary.
 69th infantry: Now at Le Havre staging area; will shuttle to England Sept. 6.
 By-Pass Assembly Areas
 17th airborne: Will by-pass assembly area and move directly to Marseille for shipment to the U. S. on Sept. 10.
 14th armored: also will by-pass assembly area and ship from Marseille Sept. 15.
 103rd infantry: En route to Le Havre.
 63rd infantry and Sixth armored: Scheduled to go to Le Havre by Sept. 9.
 Fifth and Ninth armored and 70th, 99th, and 106 infantry all will move into Reims assembly area late this week.

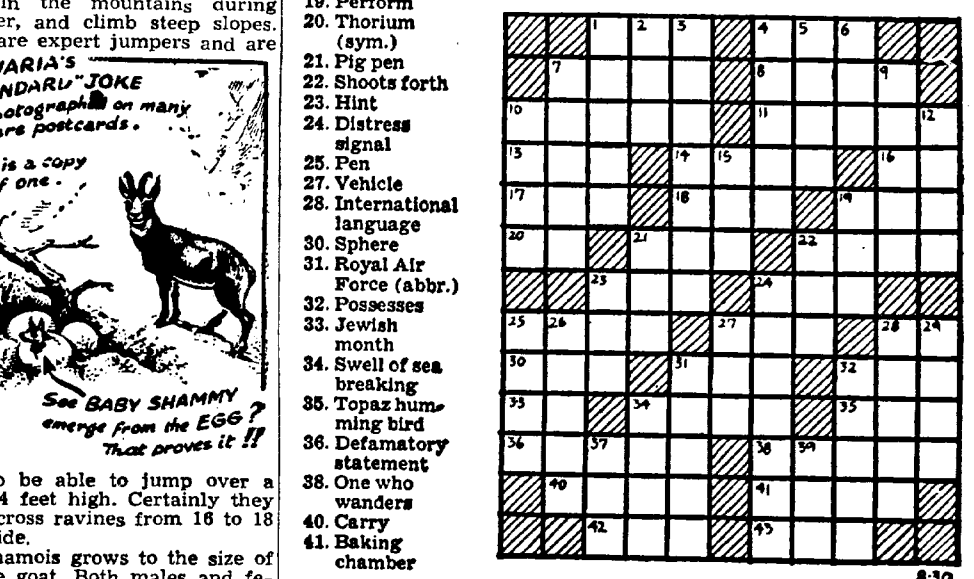
JOKESTER IN GERMANY MADE PHOTOGRAPH OF 'EGGS' LAID BY CHAMOIS
 Sometimes we may hear a person say, "I will believe it when I see it."
 That sounds as though the person is on solid ground, and usually he is. Yet at certain times a person makes a mistake when he thinks he sees a thing happen.
 A photograph may seem to be a good proof of an event, but there are "trick" photographs, as well as true ones. Take, for example, a type of postal which appeared in Bavaria during times of peace.
 This showed a mother chamois, or "shammy," standing near several large eggs. One of the eggs was partly broken, and just above the opening a baby chamois showed its head, as if it were coming from the egg!
 The actual photograph of the scene which appeared on the postal seemed to prove that the chamois had laid the eggs. We

known as "shammy skin." At times present much so-called shammy skin leather is made from the scrapbook.)
