4,200 War Prisoners Await Liberation

YOKOHAMA, Sept. 1-(AP)-Approximately 4,200 Allied prisoners of war remain to be evacuated from Japanese camps in the Tokyo-Yokohama area, Cmdr. Harold Stassen reported today. More than 1,490 already have been moved to hospital ships and transports in Tokyo bay.

Stassen, Adm Halsey's staff officer in charge of evacuating the prisoners, conferred with International Red Cross representatives




