If news from Hollywood is true, a humdinger of a musical can be found in "Out of This World," the new film which will make its debut at the Ohio theatre Friday. He plays the role of a poll-taxer who is sent into the mountains to check up on the manner of living of the mountain folk. Here his trouble starts but everything turns out fine.

CASE GRANTED GIFT FOR ATOM-SMASHING MACHINE

CLEVELAND, Sept. 6—(AP)—The Cleveland Trust Co., trustee for the Thomas H. White fund, today announced a \$4,000 gift to Case School of Applied Science for construction of an atom-smashing betatron.

There are only a few other betatrons in America, one at the University of Illinois and another being completed by the General Electric Co., Case scientists reported.

Construction of the Case betatron is expected to be completed this winter. A betatron breaks atoms with high-voltage current by speeding electrons, the particles whirling about the atom core, they said.
