## Army-Navy "E" Awards Dropped

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6—(UP)—Termination of the Army-Navy "E" award program under which some 4,000 industrial plants and other enterprises won recognition for outstanding contribution to the war effort was announced Saturday by Undersecretary of War Robert P. Patterson and Assistant Secretary of Navy H. Struve Henshel.

Awards granted at the August meetings of the Army and Navy board for production awards remain to be presented. That will end the program.

## Gurney May Get Johnson Post

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6—(UP)—Sen. Chan Gurney, (R., S. D.), probably will get the vacancy on the foreign relations committee left by the death of the late Sen. Hiram W. Johnson, (R., Calif.).

Chairman Robert A. Taft, (R., O.), of the Republican steering committee, told reporters that he and Gurney are the only eligible Republicans. Taft said he does not care to take the foreign relations assignment.

Gurney would get the assignment on the basis of seniority, Taft said. Several other senators holding the same seniority are disqualified by the rule that two senators from the same state shall not serve on the committee.

### \$100,443 Given To Crippled GI

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Sept. 6—(AP)—Pfc. Jimmy Wilson, the young GI who lost both arms and both legs in a plane crash, sat dazed and silent when he learned that the American people had contributed \$100,443 to guarantee his future.

He remained motionless in his wheelchair unable to speak. The stumps of his hands twitched as he lit a cigaret with artificial limbs. "I still can't believe it," the Stark, Fla., soldier said. "I reckon a fellow never finds out how wonderful people are until something like this happens."

The fund, raised through voluntary contributions in a coast-to-coast newspaper solicitation by the Philadelphia Inquirer Charities, Inc., will be temporarily placed in government securities until a suitable trust can be arranged to guarantee Jimmy a steady life income.

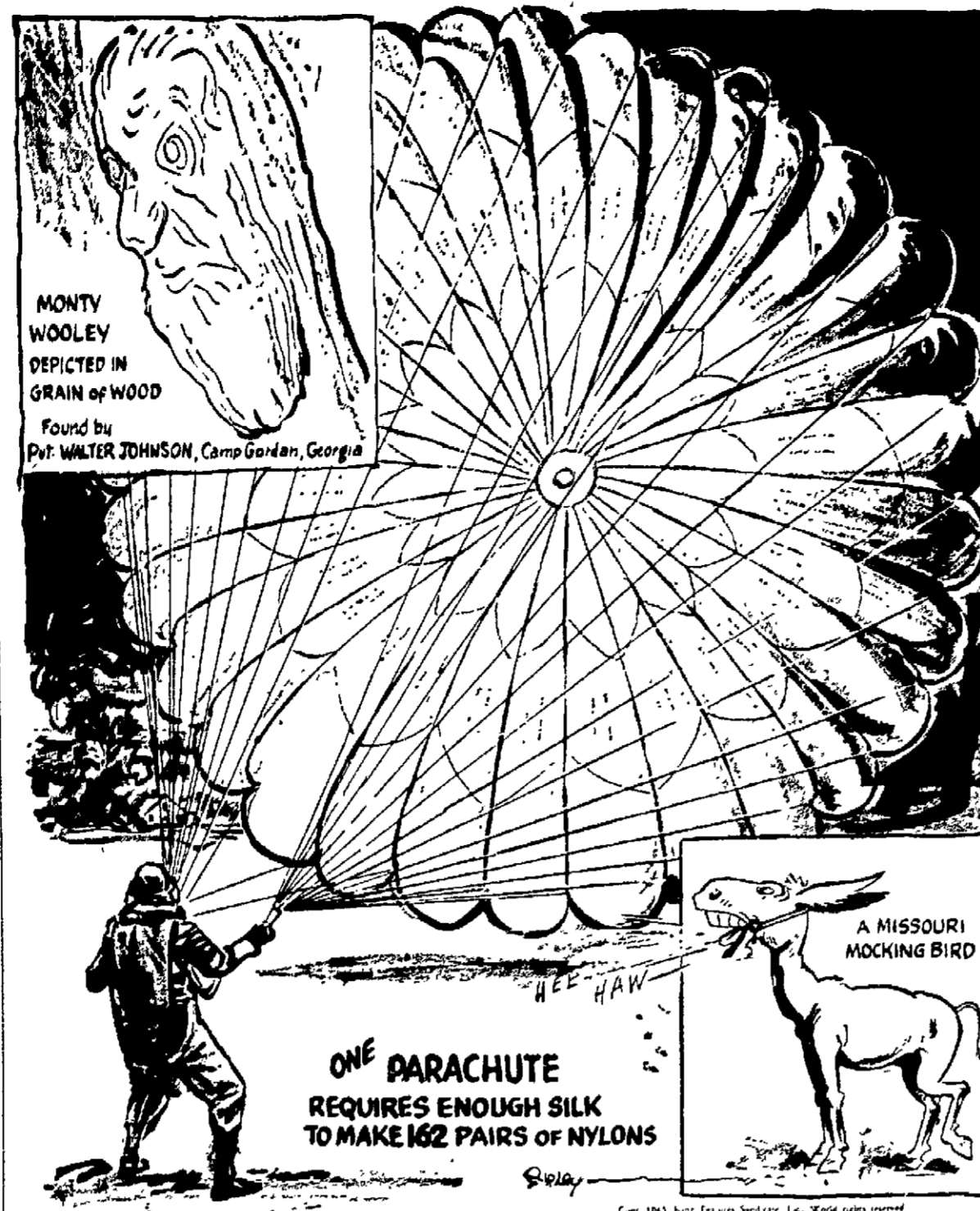

# Steel Factory Seeks Workers

CLEVELAND, Sept. 6—(INS)—While jobless compensation claims climbed near the 6,000 mark in Cleveland today, the Corrihan-McKinney plant of the Republic Steel Corp. announced an acute need for 600 additional workers. J. H. Slater, acting district manager for Republic, warned that unless the need for workers is quickly met many other industries would suffer protracted re-conversion difficulties because of the lack of steel products.

He said the company has large orders on hand from the automotive, metal construction, agricultural implement and household appliance industries. Workers are needed in every mill department, from the blast furnace to the finishing mills, he said.
