Tony Pastor Orchestra Booked By Ohio Theatre

Noted Musical Outfit Here On Wednesday

Tony Pastor, who will appear with his orcnestra at the Ohio theatre Wednesday for a personal appearance, is not only rated one of the finest musicians of the day, but also is among the best in the song writing field along Tin Pan

Many bands will tell about years of hard struggle, but such has not been the case with Pastor. Shortly before retirement of Artie Shaw, he decided to organize his own band. From that time on things came pretty easily. Since organization of his band he has played at the Paramount theatre in New York, the Canadian Exposition, Toronto, Can., the Palladium, Hollywood, the Roosevelt hotel in Washington, D. C., and many other places.

Certain American cities, among them San Francisco, seem to lend themselves to drama, adaptable equally to stage and screen. 
