

Tony Pastor Orchestra Booked By Ohio Theatre

Noted Musical Outfit Here On Wednesday

Tony Pastor, who will appear with his orchestra at the Ohio theatre Wednesday for a personal appearance, is not only rated one of the finest musicians of the day, but also is among the best in the song writing field along Tin Pan Alley.

Many bands will tell about years of hard struggle, but such has not been the case with Pastor. Shortly before retirement of Artie Shaw, he decided to organize his own band. From that time on things came pretty easily. Since organization of his band he has played at the Paramount theatre in New York, the Canadian Exposition, Toronto, Can., the Palladium, Hollywood, the Roosevelt hotel in Washington, D. C., and many other places.

Certain American cities, among them San Francisco, seem to lend themselves to drama, adaptable equally to stage and screen. "Flame of the Barbary Coast," now showing at the Quilna theatre, is a superb example. Choice of the cast was fortunate, with John Wayne starring as a carefree Montana cattleman on a visit to the big town for pleasure and adventure. Ann Dvorak plays the title role, her first American part in four years. An excellent group forms the supporting cast.

"Uncle Harry" is a gripping suspense story, superbly told, and an exceptional motion picture from every audience angle. A disquieting bond of affection between a brother and sister is a basis for the absorbing plot. George Sanders, co-starred with Geraldine Fitzgerald and Ella Raines, delivers to the fullest as the brother, Harry, displaying unsuspected versatility. Miss Fitzgerald is equally forceful in the difficult role of the sister, Lettie, whose adoration becomes an obsession. Miss Raines matches the performance of her co-stars as the third corner of the triangle. She appears as the attractive New York fashion authority who falls in love with her brother. The film is currently showing at the Sigma theatre.

Robert Young gets more than he asked for in the picture "Those Endearing Young Charms," now playing at the State theatre. You'll laugh at his hilarious antics as he tries to win a girl's heart only to throw it back to her and see her pull the same trick. Sharing the billing is a return film, "Imitation of Life" with Claudette Colbert and Warren Williams.

Tom Conway, alias The Falcon, goes Hollywood in a big way in one of his latest productions, "The Falcon in Hollywood," now showing at the Lyric theatre. The murder of an actor during filming of a motion picture engages his attention. There are many close calls for him, but as usual, he pulls thru.
