The Fifth was known as the army that had never been home. It was activated at Ojda, North Africa, on Jan. 4, 1943, and after months of intensive training began its long fighting days by securing the Salerno beachhead.

Before the Germans surrendered in the Alps, men of the Fifth had fought through Naples, Cassino, Anzio, Rome, the Gothic line of the Apennines, and the Po valley.

Fifth Army Becomes Non-Operational
ROME—(AP)—The U. S. Fifth Army, the first American force to hit the European mainland, became non-operational last Sunday, it was announced Wednesday.

The Fifth, which saw front line combat for 20 months, "went out of business" on the second anniversary of its invasion of Italy.

The Fifth was known as the army that had never been home. It was activated at Ojda, North Africa, on Jan. 4, 1943, and after months of intensive training began its long fighting days by securing the Salerno beachhead.

Before the Germans surrendered in the Alps, men of the Fifth had fought through Naples, Cassino, Anzio, Rome, the Gothic line of the Apennines, and the Po valley.
