

Sunday Films Prove To Be Well-Assorted

Grim War Tale Of Ernie Pyle Best Of Crop

Folks, it's seldom Lima theatres have a chance to offer you such a group of films as will be displayed on the screens this Sabbath. The privilege of seeing them has arrived. Why not take advantage of it?

The down-to-earth story of the American GI, the man who doesn't seem to receive any glory for all the work he's done is told in "The Story of GI Joe" with Ernie Pyle. Comedy interwoven with the grim horrors of war form the basis of the film. This film proves to be a milestone in the road of eliminating some of the exaggeration which often prevails in pictures today.

"Over 21" the film now showing at the Quilna theatre which stars Alexander Knox, Irene Dunne and Charles Coburn, is a picture to reveal in. Never did a woman get into such hilarious mix-ups. Never were there such rare delight for the young in heart. The story, although it deals with a general background of Army life at an officers' candidate school emphasizes the out-of-camp—the domestic side. The billing is "Rhythm Round-Up".
