**Heaps of Treasure Found in King Tut's Tomb**  
 Lord Carnarvon and Howard Carter were excited when they entered the tomb in the Valley of the Kings. Their first glimpse of the first room showed them more treasure than they had seen in all the tombs they had entered before. This was the tomb of Tutankhamen, often called "King Tut." Speaking of the day in 1922 when he first entered the tomb, Carter later said:

"This was the day of days, the most wonderful that I have ever lived through."  
 On that day Carter saw masses of heaped-up treasures in the outermost room of the tomb. There were statues of King Tut, along with a golden throne. There were inlaid chests, and figures of strange-looking animals, also vases and cups carved from alabaster.

Among the animal figures was a "Hathor cow." This had a long, thin body, and a tail which curved upward and forward in a loop. Hathor was the Egyptian goddess of love and joy. The cow was her special animal, and sometimes a picture, or statue, of her showed her with a human body and the head of a cow.

## 1946 State Fair Will Be Aug. 17-25, Ammon Announces

Wisconsin's state fair will return in all its glory Aug. 17-25, 1946, Ralph E. Ammon, manager, said today in announcing dates and preliminary plans for the nine-day event.

All brakes will be off on entertainment and educational features. Auto races, thrill shows, motorcycle races, and grand circuit harness races are back on the program.

Application has already been filed for AAA sanctioned auto races, and the Wisconsin state fair has been granted grand circuit dates that assure a fast field of the nation's outstanding harness horses.

Work begins soon on the newly acquired 67-acre addition which will greatly increase the parking facilities at State Fair park.

Ammon said that Dairy Day and the state dairy queen contest will be brought back to the 1946 state fair program. Queens crowned at the 1946 and 1947 state fairs will be featured at the coronation ceremonies for the centennial dairy queen in 1948.

Fair-goers can look forward to big displays of new goods and products in the home appliance show scheduled for the industrial building, and the latest in mechanical equipment on the farm machinery lots at the 1946 state fair, Ammon declared.

Premium lists for next year's state fair are now in preparation.

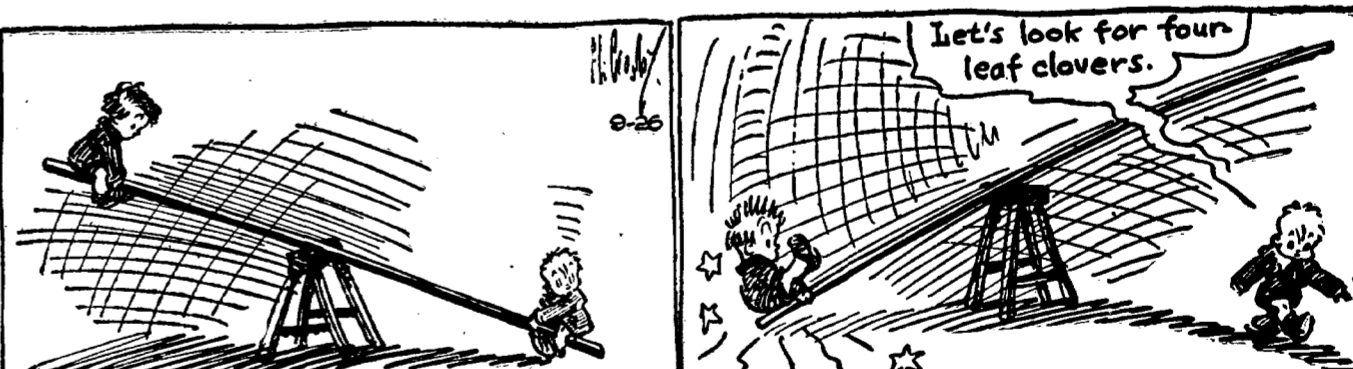
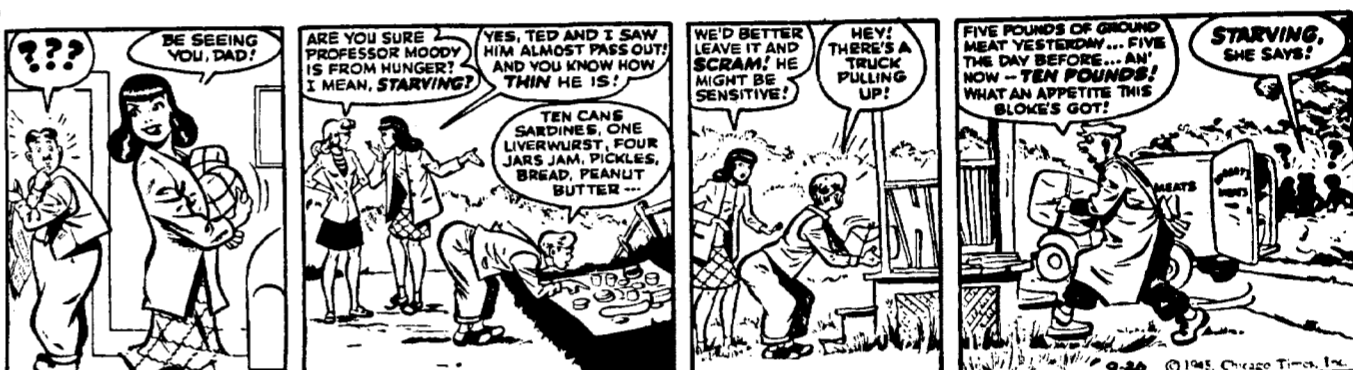
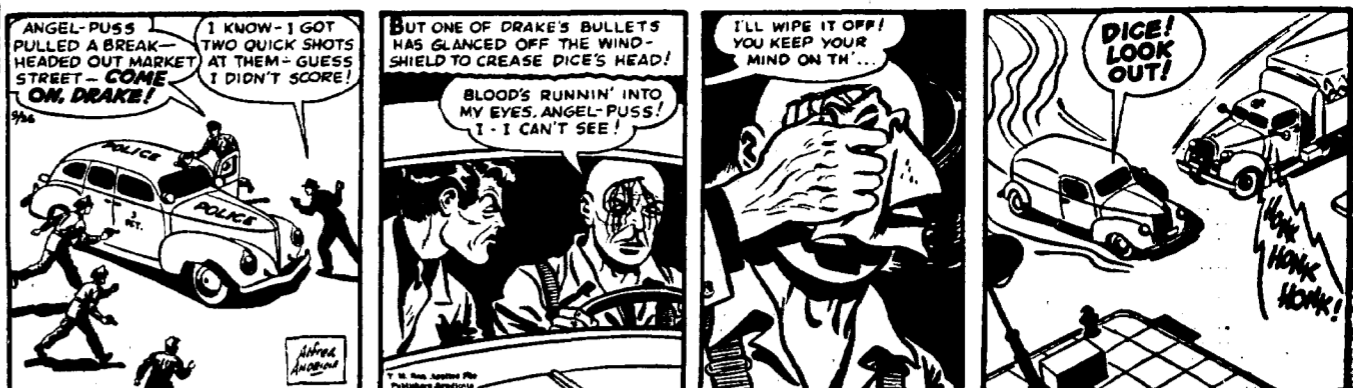
