

Story Of Jap Treachery May Make You Fightin' Mad

Violence, bloodshed and infamous treachery—Jap variety—will run riot on the screen of the Ohio theatre Friday when "Blood On The Sun," latest James Cagney feature opens there.

More than sincere propaganda, more than revealing history, the sensational film-story tells of an American newspaperman's discovery of the evil Tanaka Memorial—1928 Nip plan for world conquest—and the many adventures that followed this. Its further unveiling of Jap perfidy will make you fighting mad at the Nips, but you'll be cheating yourself if this prevents you from seeing it.

The ugliness of divorce—that which, during the past few years has marred the books of matrimony—looms its head again in the film "Divorce" opening at the Quilna theatre Friday. With Kay Francis in the role of the temptress, the hearts and hillfolks that she wins will make you catch your breath in surprise. 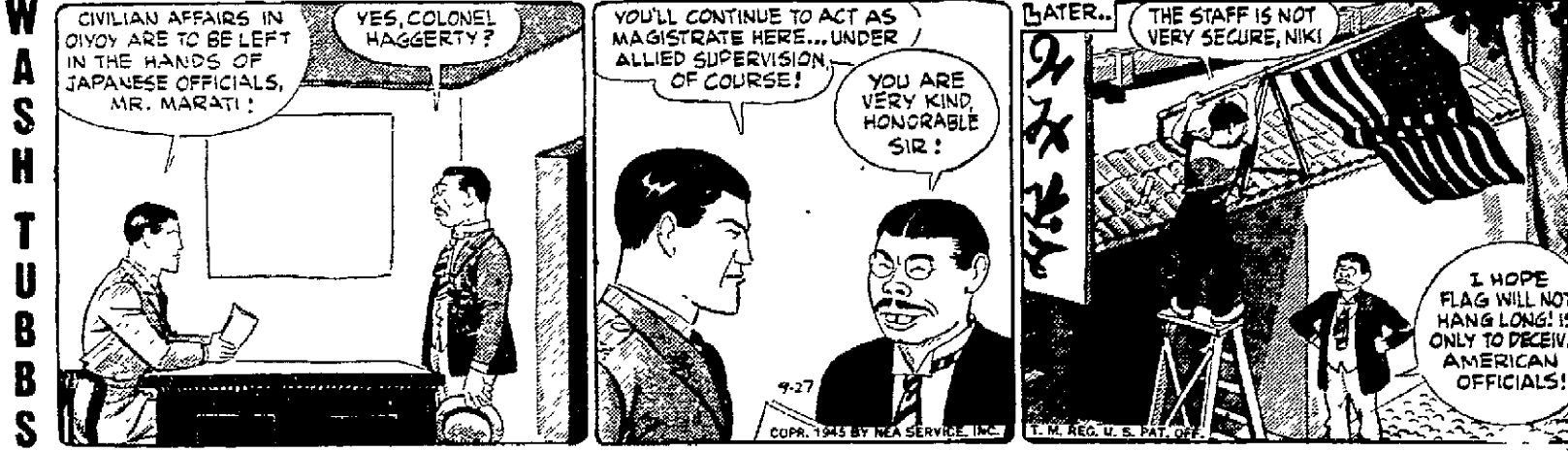
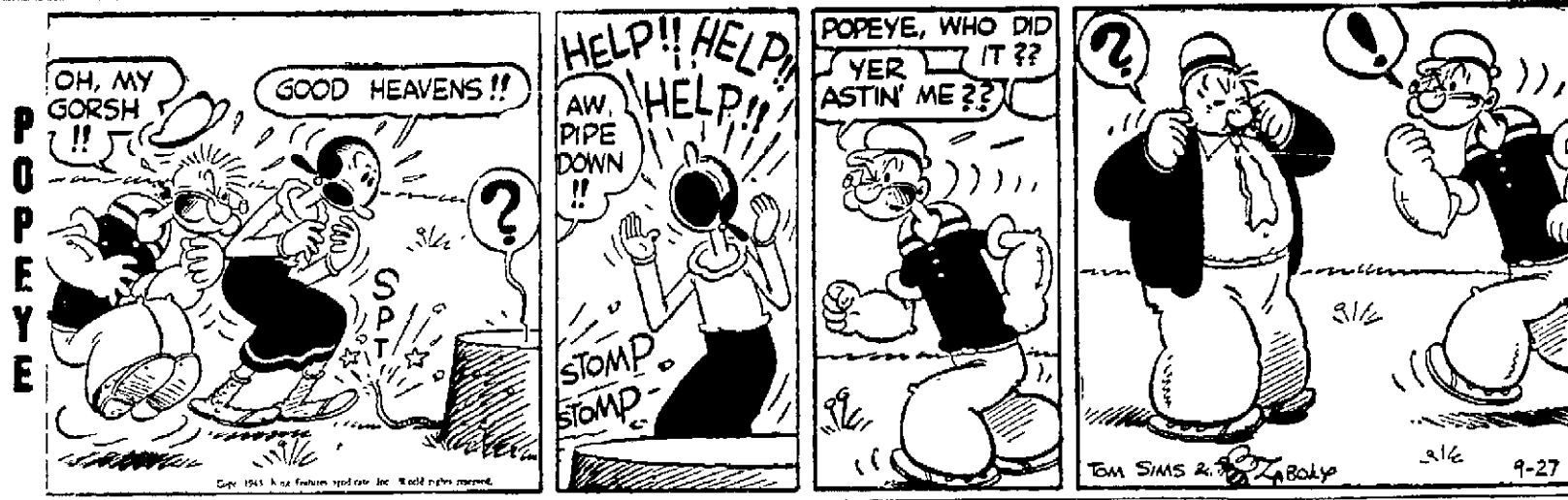
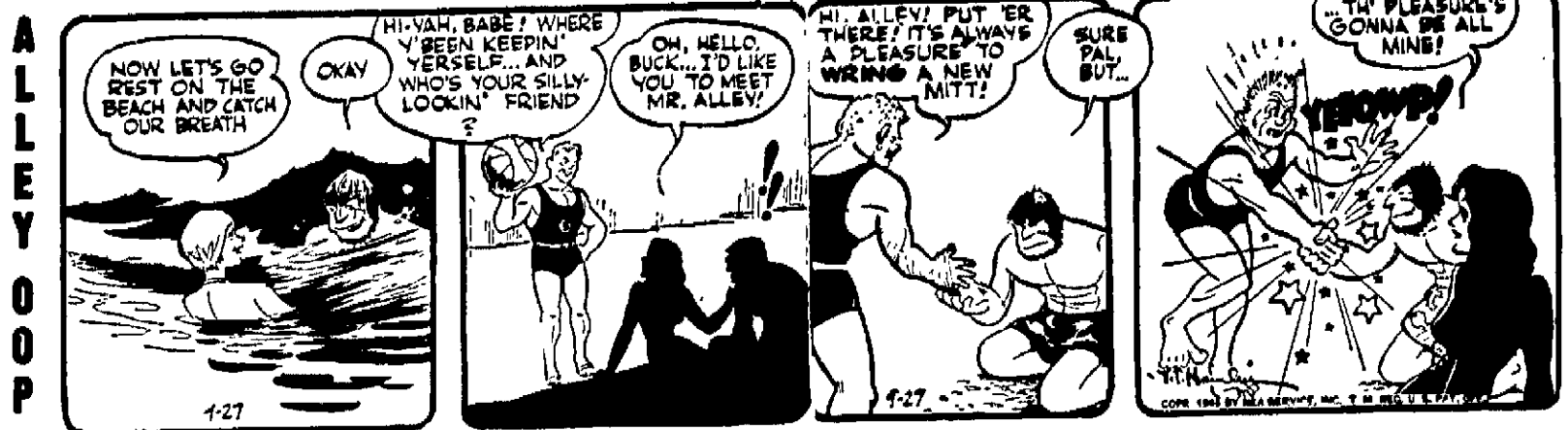
