



REPORT ACCORD BETWEEN CHINESE, COMMUNISTS

LONDON, Sept. 29-(AP)-The Moscow radio reported today that Generalisismo Chiang Kai-Shek and Communist Leader Mao Tse-, Tung, who have been conferring at Chungking in an effort to settle China's internal political differences, had reached an agreement to reform the national government.

The broadcast said the agreement provided for wider political representation in the central government and for the holding of general elections at an early date. The pact also was said to provide for demobilization of the Communist armed forces.
