### Burton Reveals Last Nominees

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1—(UP)—Sen. Harold M. Burton today announced his final appointments to the U. S. military and naval academies.

Appointed to West Point were Wallace G. Christner, Toledo, and William P. Lowry, Cincinnati. Appointed to the Naval Academy at Annapolis were James Snow, Akron, and Frederick A. Edwards, Jr., Troy.

One of the third alternates to West Point was William S. Price, 18, of Canton, son of Mrs. Thomas E. Roderick.

The senator said the appointees were selected on the basis of competitive examinations held last July and that the youths chosen will enter the academies in June or July of 1946.

### 150,000 Jobs Said "Going Begging"

NEW YORK, Oct. 1—(INS)—The National Industrial Council reported today that more than 150,000 jobs are "going begging" in a few scattered cities in ten states.

The continuing spot survey on unemployment, according to the NIC, represents reports from only 17 of the council affiliates and shows that Chicago heads the list of "help wanted" cities with 55,000 jobs available.

Other cities and states high on the list included the Kansas City area with 25,696; state of West Virginia, 20,000; Minneapolis and St. Paul area, 12,800; Cincinnati and Milwaukee areas, 8,000 to 10,000 and Columbus, O., 2,000 to 3,000.
