COLUMBUS, Oct. 2 (UP)—The Ohio Bureau of unemployment compensation and the United States Employment Service for Ohio today conducted a survey to determine the state's employment prospects during early 1946.

All employers in Ohio with three or more workers on any type of vessels operating on the Great Lakes or other navigable waters in the state now are covered by recent amendments to the Ohio unemployment compensation law.
