

Murder Mystery To Start Thursday At State Theatre

"Midnight Manhunt" is the title, and an apt one at that, for the murder-mystery film opening Thursday at the State theatre. It stars William Gargan and Ann Savage in a thriller which features Leo Gorcey, the tough little kid of Dead End Street.

Of course, the corpus delicti figures prominently in the action and both Gargan and Ann compete for the privilege of taking over the body and scoring a scoop for their respective papers.

In the process, however, there's enough excitement to pack into the dozen such years. Much of the action takes place in a wax museum which houses famous gangster relics, including dummies of former leaders of the underworld.

The treachery of the Japanese had to begin somewhere and it is shown just where in "Blood on the Sun" with Jimmy Cagney and Sylvia Sydney currently showing at the Ohio theatre. As the Germans had their "Mein Kampf" and the Japanese had a similar document. It was the Tanaka Memorial—a manuscript which outlined the Japanese plan for world conquest. Here lies the story; the one you'll not want to miss.

During the last few years, technical pictures have become more and more plentiful, but still it's seldom that we get two full length features on one bill. The chance has finally arrived, altho, at the Quilna theatre. Two pictures which have returned by popular request are "Song of the Islands" with Betty Grable and Jack Oakie, and "Black Swan" with Tyrone Power and Maureen O'Hara.

"The Blush of the Year"—that is the name critics have given to "Men In Her Diary" the film which is currently showing at the Sigma theatre, starring Peggy Ryan, Jon Hall and Louise Albritton. Sharing the billing is "The Hidden Eye" with Edward Arnold. The latter tells of a blind detective who has a magnificent trait of being able to detect certain things that men with their right vision can't see.
