Japanese Gold Hoard Guarded

TOKYO, Oct. 9 (UP)—Armed guards of the First Cavalry Division tonight surrounded the Japanese navy ministry after U. S. officials said hoards of loot from Japan's lost empire might be stored in official government buildings. A terse announcement said merely U. S. officials had learned that "previous metal," presumably stolen in Japan's years of military conquest, was in the navy ministry building. It was reliably reported that more troops may be placed shortly at other Japanese buildings to guard similar hoards.

INVASION MONEY IS TURNED OUT BY ALLIES

BERLIN, Oct. 9 (AP)—Allied printing presses already have turned out more than \$1,000,000,000 of green, red and brown invasion money to finance the four-power occupation of Germany. A reliable source said the Russians had printed 5,000,000,000 marks, the Americans 3,000,000,000, the British 2,000,000,000 and the French more than 1,000,000,000. The mark is worth 10 cents at the military exchange rate. Only a portion of the invasion money has been placed in circulation. Because of a difference in the financial system used, the Russians have spent a higher percentage of their money than the other occupying powers. The Russians issue marks to their troops to pay for commodities and services. The Americans, British and French sign checks for commodities and services. The checks are redeemable in marks at the offices of the burgomeisters.
