At the beginning of the present century, the output of the pulp and paper industry in Canada was valued at about \$5,000,000. In 1943, the value had reached \$345,500,000.

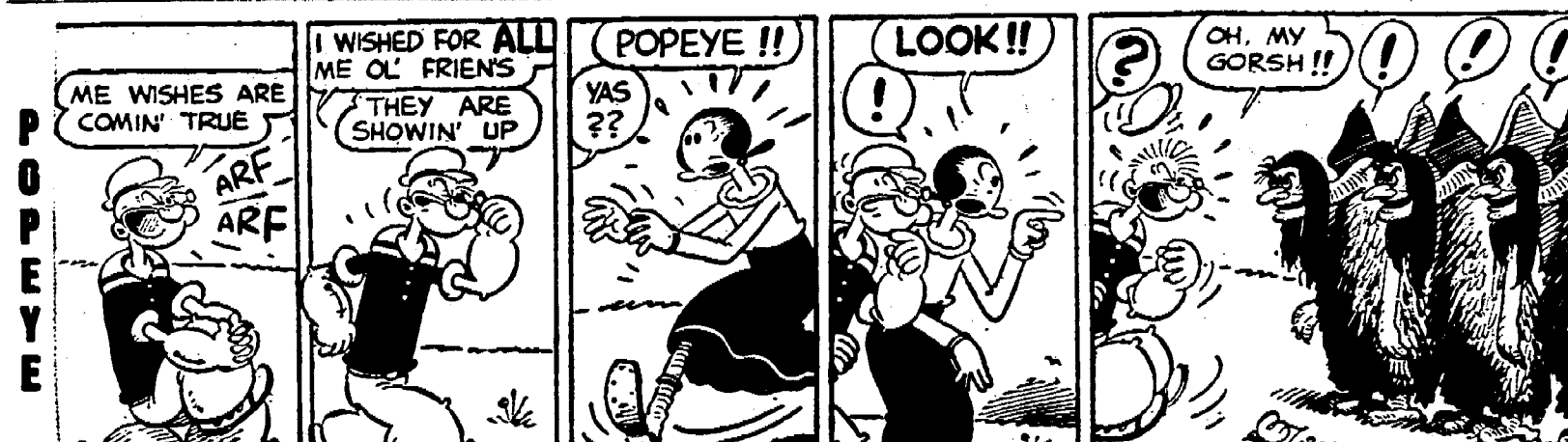
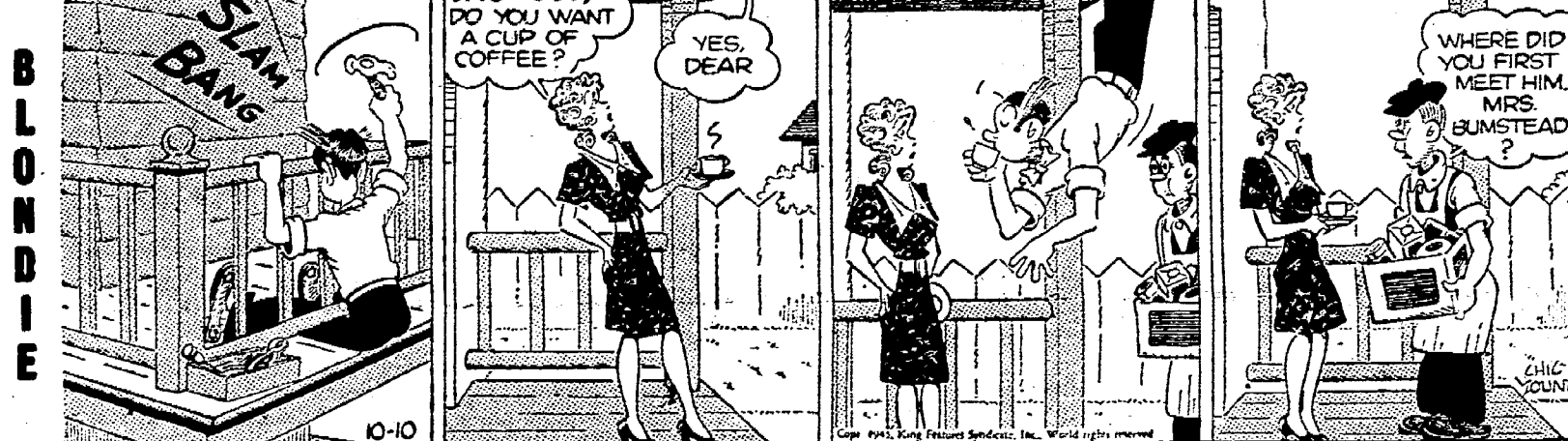
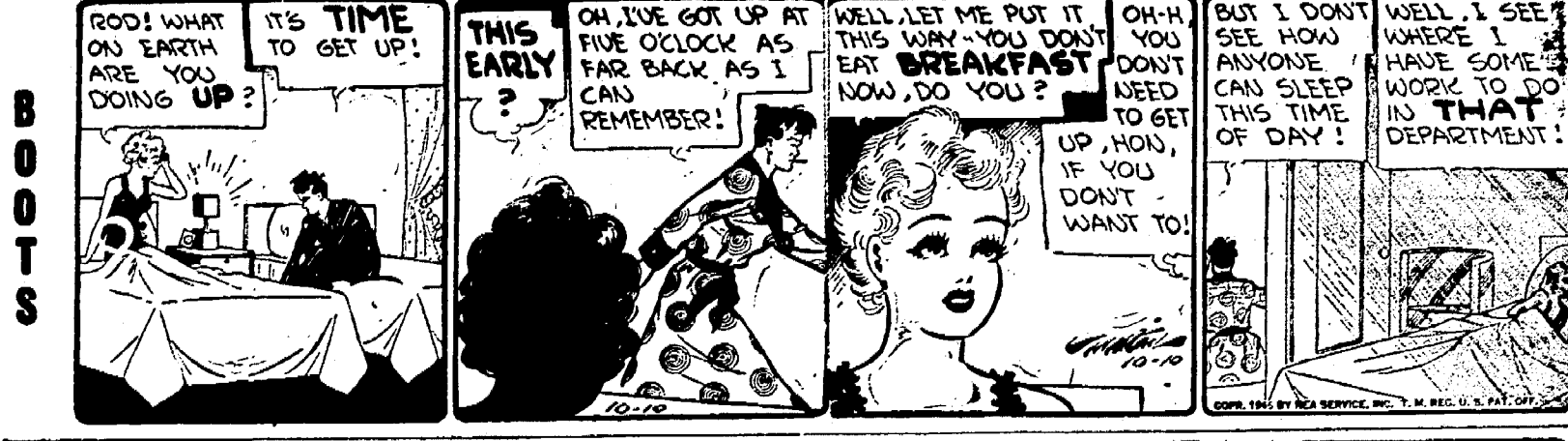
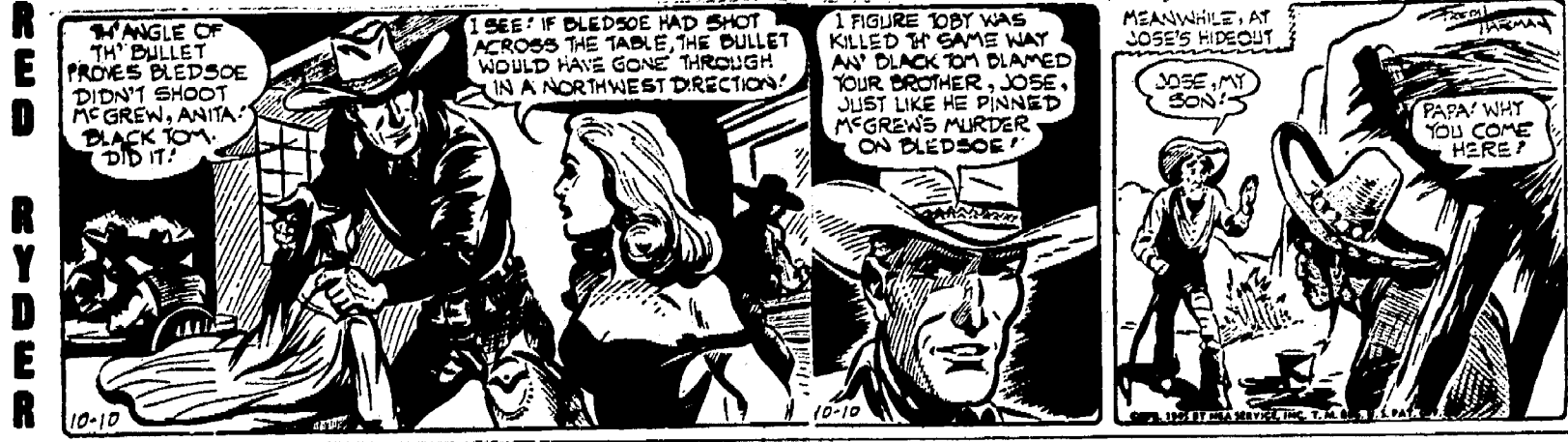
