\$200,000 BLAZE HITS CLEVELAND CONCERNS

CLEVELAND, Oct. 13.—(UP)—Authorities today were trying to determine the origin of a blaze yesterday which destroyed an oil warehouse and four other buildings causing a loss estimated at \$200,000.

The warehouse was owned by the E. F. H. Aluminum Foundry and Smelting Co. and contained approximately \$1,000 arrels of oil and greases, according to William Ferrie, battalion chief.
