Radio Scripts To Be Checked WASHINGTON, Oct. 20—(UP)

-The house un-American activities committee intends to expand its current radio "review" to examine scripts of "virtually every well-known news commentator," it was learned today.

A spokesman said the committec, which already has "requested" scripts of seven commentators, plans eventually to study the program of "all types of news analysts-conservative, liberal and inbetween."

"The committee is engaged in determining just what is un-Americanism." he said. "And to do that we've got to find out what the average commentator thinks about the various issues of the day. We try to listen to most of them, but can't get around to them all. Therefore, we have to send for their scripts."

The commentators whose scripts have been "requested" are Cecil Brown (Mutual). Sidney Walton (WHN-New York). Johannes Steel (WHN-New York). William S. Gailor (American Broadcasting). J. Raymond Walsh (WMCA-New York), Raymond Swing (American) and Hans Jacob (WOV-New York).


