

Sunday's Films Feature Plenty Of Action

Gershwin Life Is Feature Of Ohio Picture

Everywhere you turn these days, you can find action from the movement of ballet artists to a nine inning baseball game. Some of this action has been incorporated in the movies now showing on local screens.

When George Gershwin was young, he had such a desire to learn music that he would play the piano in a penny arcade. He surprised his parents when, after the Gershwins had acquired a new piano, George immediately began to play Melody in F.

The progress and accomplishments of this great musician and composer are shown in the film "Rhapsody In Blue" now showing at the Ohio theatre. At the film's premiere earlier in the month, organist Joe Hamm formerly of Cleveland, now the music maker at the local roller rink, presented a program of music preceding the premiere. Several persons have asked this reviewer who he was and later offered their congratulations on such a splendid program of music.

The screen's two happiest hits are back to delight you again. "Pennies From Heaven," starring Bing Crosby, and "Mr. Deeds Goes to Town," starring Gary Cooper and Jean Arthur, are now playing at the Quilna theatre. 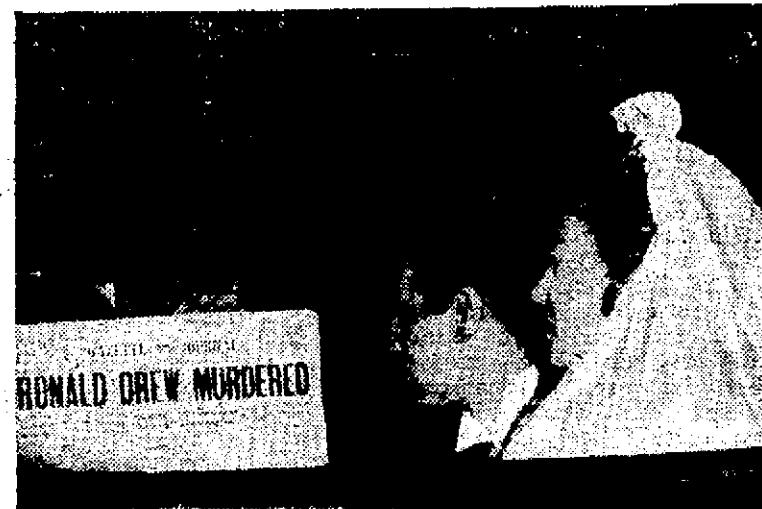
