

Ohio Has Kelly And Sinatra Teamed In "Anchors Aweigh"

Teaming Gene Kelly, Frank Sinatra, Kathryn Grayson and Jose Iturbi in one great salvo of melody and merriment, "Anchors Aweigh," the new technicolor musical opening Friday at the Ohio theatre has become a roadside salute to the entertainment world.

CLEVELAND, Oct. 25 — (AP)—The general council of the Presbyterian church of the United States has authorized publication of a weekly news magazine under auspices of the church.

At a meeting here yesterday the council also recommended an increase of more than \$500,000 in the church's benevolence budget for the next fiscal year.

Budget for the current year was approximately \$10,500,000. The council appropriated \$120,000 for promotion of the magazine, scheduled to begin publication Jan. 1
