Spine-chilling facts are exploded with shocking reality before America's eyes of secret dangers that threatened the heart of the nation in its struggle with Nazi Germany in "The House on 92nd Street" which is making its debut at the Quilna theatre Friday.

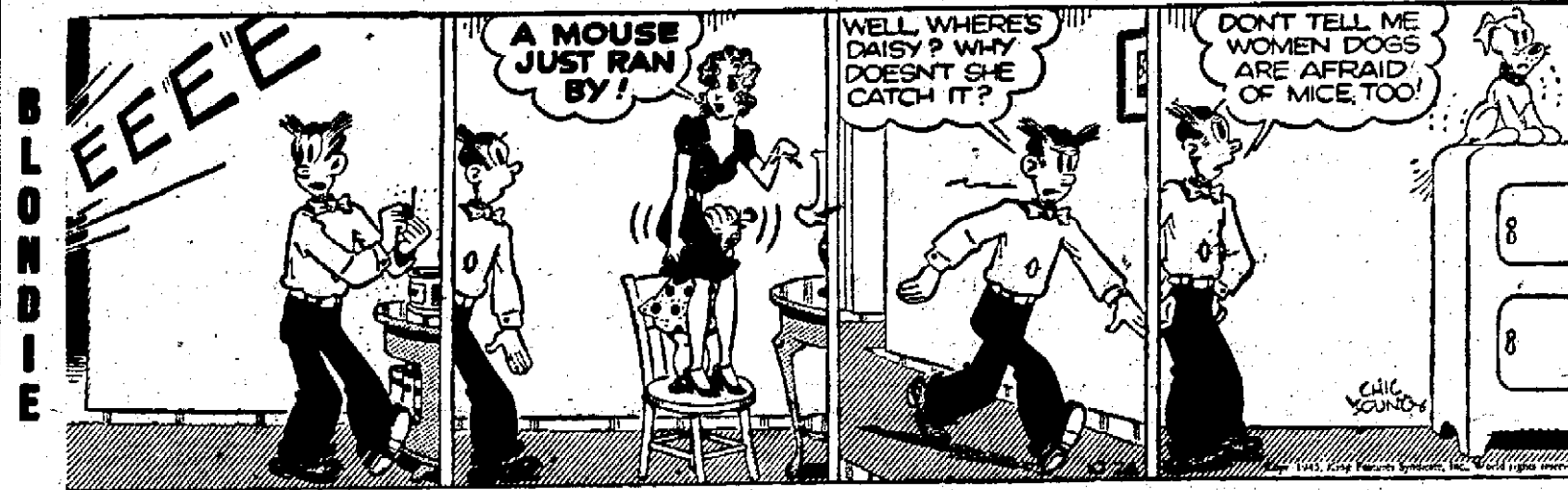
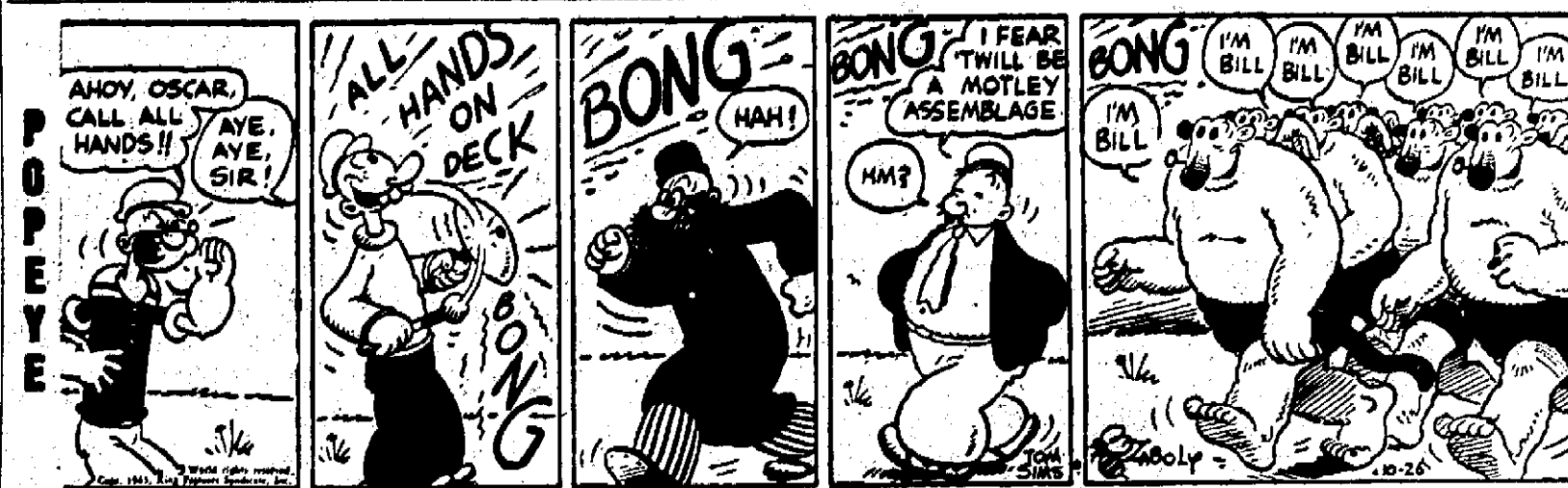
