Uncle Ray's Corner Ancient Chinese Had System of

Picture Writing
People in most countries use an alphabet of one kind or another when they write. That, however, is not true of China, where more than 400,000,000 people live.


Efforts to work out a Chinese alphabet have been made, but these efforts have failed so far.
Old customs die slowly in China. The written language of China has grown out of thousands of picture words. To this day, it is a kind of "picture-writing." In most cases, it is hard to find clear pictures in the present words, but the idea has been kept to a large extent even though changes have

extent even though changes have taken place.

Some early Chinese picture words were marked on bone, others on shells. Still others were B carved on bronze, About 3,800 by years ago a picture word for "sun" was made. This was a circle with 5 rays coming from it.

time were images of the moon. Some of these were half-moons, and others were crescents.

Queer pictures of carts appear in ancient Chinese writing. Most

of these have three wheels, but some have only two.

The picture words for animals were very clear in mnay cases. The "hu," or tiger, was shown with stripes as well as with a curved tail and open mouth. The elephant was provided with a good-sized trunk, and the "yang," or sheep, was decorated with a huge horn. of these have three wheels, but

huge horn. Old Chinese picture words for fish showed these water animals with fins and tails. On the head of each fish picture was a dot which showed an eye.

When we speak about writing our minds may turn to the picture words used in Egypt and Babylonia thousands of years ago.





