Ohio's Movie Offers Four Women Stars

Here it is, the first Sunday in November and what could be better than a good movie?

"Week-End At The Waldorf," now showing at the Ohio theatre, takes theatregoers on a 48-hour visit inside the world's most famous and fabulous hotel with four of the nation's most glamorous screen stars—Ginger Rogers, Lana Turner, Walter Pidgeon and Van Johnson.

It is an adventure drama which not only is a vehicle for that priceless quartet of stars, but is at the same time, a saturated solution of romance, suspense, humor and tragedy.

Hailed as one of the most exciting film thrillers of the year, "And Then There Were None," the spine-chilling picturization of Agatha Christie's world-famous masterpiece of mystery, continues its stay at the Quilna theatre. Wallace Beery plays the lead in one of the most stirring films ever made around the U. S. Marine Corps. With comedy and pathos, the picture tells of the battles fought by faithful Filipinos to stave off the onslaught of the Japanese in the earliest stage of the Pacific war. The film is "Salute To The Marines" and is currently showing at the Allen theatre.
