to drive the Danes from England when the event took place.

Whether or not that story is true. Affred did a great deal more than home processors. than burn cakes or fight the R Danes. In the years when his kingdom was free from war, he worked to bring about better education

Alfred was born 11 centuries ago. He ruled a large part of England from 871 until his death in

King Alfred caused new schools to be built, and in these schools written at that time. This was a step forward, because the old custom had been to teach pupils Latin, but nothing about the native language.
