UNCLE RAY'S CORNER

KING ALFRED HELPED EDUCATION IN OLD ENGLAND
When someone speaks about Alfred the Great, we are likely to think of the story of how he let cakes burn one day while he was lost in thought. It is said that he was trying to figure out how to drive the Danes from England when the event took place. Whether or not that story is true, Alfred did a great deal more than burn cakes or fight the Danes. In the years when his kingdom was free from war, he worked to bring about better education.

Alfred was born 11 centuries ago. He ruled a large part of England from 871 until his death in 901.

King Alfred caused new schools to be built, and in these schools the pupils learned the English language, as it was spoken and written at that time. This was a step forward, because the old custom had been to teach pupils Latin, but nothing about the native language.

Children of nobles went to the schools in Alfred's time. Princes of the royal household also attended.

The king wanted education to be open for other children besides those of noble families. "All free-born youths," he declared, "should be set to learn until they are able to read English writing."

On the continent of Europe, before the time of Alfred, an emperor known as Charlemagne helped the cause of education. This ruler could do hardly more than write his own name, but he ordered that schools should be kept for youths in the lands under his power.

During the Middle Ages, several important universities were started in Italy and elsewhere. Such Italian cities as Salerno, Bologna, Padua and Florence became centers of learning. Oxford and Cambridge were the chief universities in England. Heidelberg, Germany, also became the home of a famous university.

The college students of the Middle Ages ranged from youths 30 and 50 years of age.
