Webster graduated from Yale and, at the age of 23, was admitted to the bar. Although he was prepared to practice law, he changed his mind and became a teacher.

The first thing Webster noticed was the poor quality of the textbooks which were used at that time. Before his twenty-fifth birthday, he started to work on three new textbooks, one of them a speller, the others a grammar and a reader. Those books were successful

and soon were being used in vari-ous parts of New England. The spelling book, in particular, won wide-spread favor during the wide-spread favor during the following years. Many thousands of copies of the speller were printed and the young teacher received a royalty of a little less than a cent on each copy sold.
