

Joan Crawford Starring In Ohio's "Mildred Pierce"

"Mildred Pierce," the screen adaptation of James Cain's hard-boiled saga of a soft-hearted lady, starring Joan Crawford in one of the most exciting roles of her career, arrives Friday at the Ohio theatre. 32 Arrested In Narcotic Raids

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—(UP)—Thirty-two men were arraigned in federal district court here today on narcotic charges after a series of police raids last night resulted in 134 arrests. The raid was the biggest in district history.

Police raided 34 alleged "dens" here in coordination with similar raids in Baltimore and New York after it was charged that drug peddlers were "turning boys into thieves and young girls into street-walkers."

Most of those arrested were expected to be released after questioning, subject to possible recall as witnesses. Federal and district police took part in the raids.

They refused to estimate the value of drugs seized but they included 80 ounces of heroin valued at \$4,000 along with quantities of morphine, marijuana and opium.
