Amateur Radio Operators Get New Frequencies

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10—(AP)—Amateur radio operators will have new frequency bands starting Nov. 15, the Federal Communications Commission announced today, and added it had extended the operators' licenses to May 15, 1946.

The commission also revoked the wartime order prohibiting amateurs from communicating with foreign stations.

The amateurs' temporary authority to operate in the frequency band 112 to 115.5 megacycles expires Nov. 15.

The following bands may be used by amateurs, effective Nov. 15: 28 to 29.7 megacycles, using type A1 emission.

28.1 to 29.5 megacycles, using type A3 emission.

28.5 to 29.7 megacycles, using special emission for radio-telephony (FM).

56 to 60 megacycles, using types A1, A2, A3 and A4 emissions and on frequencies 58.5 to 60 megacycles, special emission for radio telephony.

144 to 148 megacycles, using A1, A2, A3 and A4 emissions and special emissions for radiotelephony and radiotelegraphy.

2,300 to 2,450 megacycles, 5,250 to 5,650 megacycles, 10,000 to 10,500 megacycles, and 21,000 to 22,000 megacycles, using on these four bands A1, A2, A3, A4 and A5 emissions and special emissions for radiotelephony and radiotelegraphy.

Davis' appearance will coincide with the 25th anniversary of his ever popular "Margie."

27,500 Figure For Guard Is Tentative
COLUMBUS, Nov. 10—(UP)—Adj. Gen. Donald F. Pancoast today had warned that the 27,500-man figure for the Ohio National Guard mentioned in connection with the War Department's post-war military program to maintain a large organized military force, was only an estimate.
