Ohio's Movie High Tribute To Crawford

Billing top-flight movies is no easy job, as you might learn if you were to ask any local theatre manager, but Lima has been doing it right along and this week is no exception. One look at the theatre marquees and you'll know. The Ohio theatre's "Mildred Fierce" is an event. Alternately tender and gruff, tightly objective and searingly personal, it is a credit to any Hollywood studio. It represents the high-water mark in the career of one of screenland's most important ladies, for, in the title role, Joan Crawford offers an unforgettable, intensely human characterization of a woman bedeviled from without by the vagaries of fortune and cruelties of those for whom she cares most, and from within by a passionate, illogical devotion to the very persons who plot her destruction.


