

Another Lineup Of Good Films On Tap

Ohio's Movie High Tribute To Crawford

Billing top-flight movies is no easy job, as you might learn if you were to ask any local theatre manager, but Lima has been doing it right along and this week is no exception. One look at the theatre marquee and you'll know.

The Ohio theatre's "Mildred Pierce" is an event. Alternately tender and searingly personal, it is a credit to the high-water mark in the career of one of screenland's most important ladies. For in the title role, Joan Crawford offers an unforgettable, intensely human characterization of a woman bedeviled from without by the vagaries of fortune and cruelities of those for whom she cares most, and from within by a passionate, illogical devotion to the very persons who plot her destruction.

For a good time and for a great opportunity to learn to understand youth, "Kiss And Tell," now showing at the Quilna theatre, is the picture for you. Based on some of the instances of American youth, the picture has been drawing praise from almost every theatre writer and critic throughout the country. Shirley Temple has another fairly grown-up role and plays it with the ease and accuracy of a veteran.

Hollywood doesn't look the same in "In Hollywood" the picture starring Bud Abbott and Lou Costello and currently showing at the Sigma theatre. Between these two comedians, the town is painted red in nothing flat. It's a riot—a film worth seeing.

Betty Hutton has one of the most outstanding roles of her career in "Incendiary Blonde" in which she is starred with Arturo de Cordova and Barry Fitzgerald. Playing at the State theatre, the picture is destined to draw as great a crowd as it has in theatres throughout the U. S. Betty plays the well-known Texas Guinan, "queen of the nite clubs" in the roaring '20's.

Martha O'Driscoll, the Andrews Sisters and Noah Beery, Jr. keep things active in "Her Lucky Night" now showing at the Lyric theatre and starring these five persons. Sharing the billing is a horse-racing film "Harrigan's Kid."

Leo Gorcey shows how things should be done in "Mr. Muggs Steps Out" now playing at the Allen theatre. When he steps out on his crowd then things really happen. But it's even funnier when his gang decides to join him. The co-feature is "Rustlers of the Badlands."
