Two of the worst men in history were Roman emperors. I am thinking of Nero and Caligula. They were also good emperors. Chief of these are the ones who are known today as the "Five Good Emperors."
Among the Five Good Emperors was Hadrian. He is famous as the builder of Hadrian's Wall, and there also are other reasons to remember him.
Hadrian was born in Spain in the year 76. He belonged to a Roman family, but his ancestors had settled, long before, in the colony of Spain, or Hispania, as it was called then.
When he was nine years old, Hadrian lost his father. His cousin, Trajan, became one of his guardians, and this fact was to be very important in his life.
Some of Hadrian's boyhood years were spent at Rome, where he was placed under the care of tutors. He liked his studies, and most of all he found enjoyment in learning the Greek language. Because of his interest in Greek books, he became perhaps the most learned of all Roman emperors.
There was, at first, little reason to suppose that Hadrian ever would be emperor. His cousin Trajan was a general in the Roman army, however, and rose high in royal favor.
The emperor Nerva ruled for only two years, but while he was on the throne, he "adopted" Trajan as a son and heir. At the time of his adoption, Trajan was 44 years old.
Without children of his own, Trajan grew more and more fond of his cousin. He made the young man an officer in the Roman army.
At that time, the Romans were at war with Dacia, a country in the Danube valley. Hadrian was

placed at the head of a legion. A Roman legion usually con-

tained from 4,000 to 6,000 soldiers. After victory was won, the em-

peror gave Hadrian a diamond sign that Hadrian was in line for the throne. This gift was taken as a
