of his life. He was Trajan, the Roman emperor. At the head of several Roman legions, he made his way eastward until he reached the Persian gulf.

During a campaign of conquest, Trajan passed through the lands where the old Babylonian kings had ruled. Babylon had passed away long before, but the Romans had sharp fights with Parthian soldiers before they were able to reach the gulf.

Feeling that he was a great conqueror, Trajan turned back toward Rome. He never was to see that city, again, however. Along the way he fell sick and died.

Meanwhile a cousin of the emperor had been named governor of Syria. This cousin was Hadrian when he had reached the age of 41.

When news came to Syria about the ruler's death, Hadrian was proclaimed as the Roman emperor. The soldiers liked him, and he was well received by the people when he returned to Rome.

The new emperor was a man of peace. He had taken part in war, but he wanted to let the Roman people enjoy years without the cost and sorrow which are brought on by fighting.

In an effort to end border troubles, Hadrian made a treaty with the Parthians. This treaty gave back the lands which had been taken away from them by Trajan. He also granted the Armenians the right to have their own king.

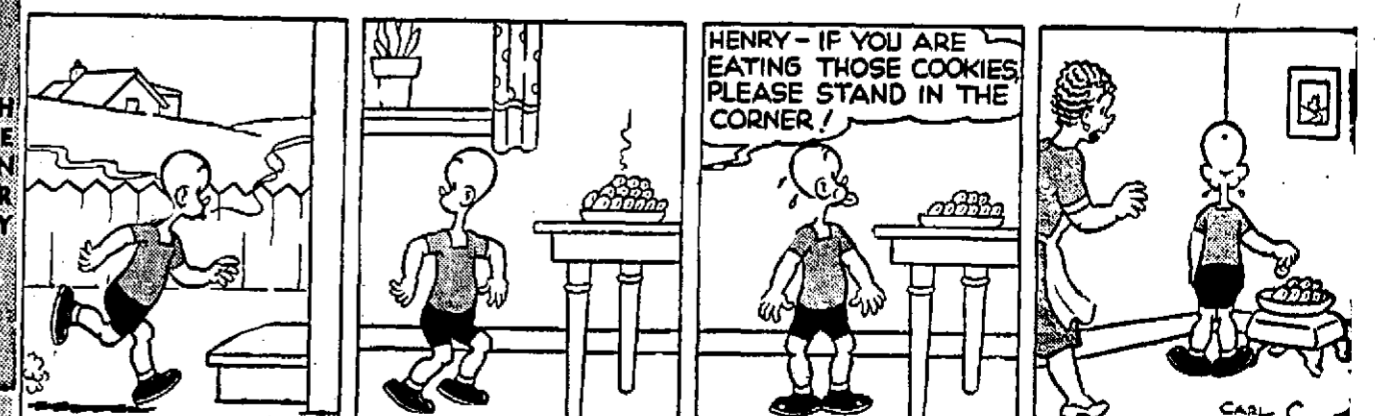
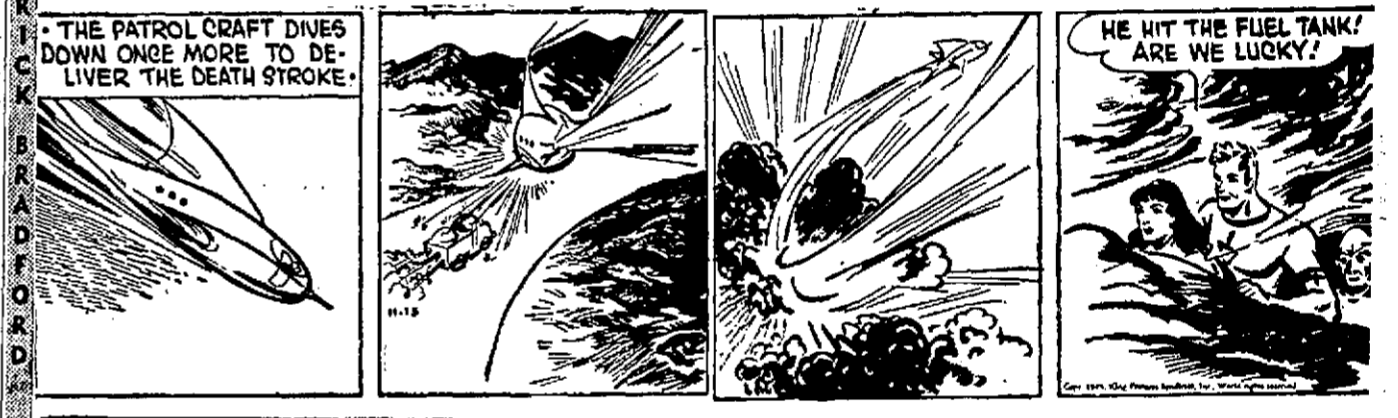
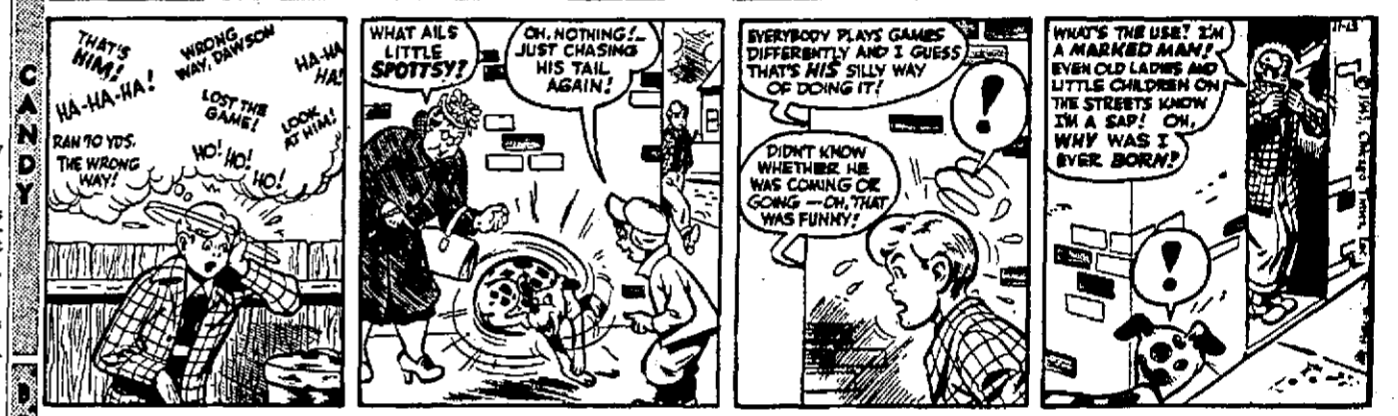
Some of the old army generals were angered when they learned that the conquered lands had been returned. They drew a plot to kill Hadrian, but the plot failed, and they were punished. If we study statues and paintings of the early Roman emperors, we find that all of them before Hadrian were smooth-shaven. Hadrian changed this custom, and grew a beard. He is said to have done this because he admired the ways of the Greeks. He had visited Greece during his eastern travels, and had adopted the Greek custom of letting the beard grow. This little point is of special interest because it led several of the later Roman emperors to wear beards.
