

Lamour And Hall To Co-Star In "Hurricane" At Quilna

Sweeping across the screen in full force beginning Friday will be "The Hurricane" with Dorothy Lamour and Jon Hall in the title roles.

Federal Pay Boost Idea Sidetracked

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16—(UP)—President Truman's bid for a 20 per cent boost in pay for government workers is in danger of being stalemated in the senate civil service committee until early 1946, it was learned today.

Senators on the committee were said to be locked five to five over the advisability of granting a wage increase now.

One group, led by Chairman Sheridan Downey, (D-Calif.), wants congress to okay a wage increase for federal workers before it goes home for Christmas. Another group, led by Sen. Harry F. Byrd, (D-Va.), wants to delay action, preferably until spring.

This was disclosed by an authoritative committee source as the senators met in executive session to discuss proposals to boost federal workers' pay 20 per cent and increase by \$10,000 a year the salaries of cabinet members, congressmen, federal judges, and department heads.

TYPE AB BLOOD FOUND RARE IN SPRINGFIELD

DEFIANCE, Nov. 16—(UP)—Persons with type AB blood are needed in Springfield. Hospital authorities said here today that only two people in the city have the rare blood type.

A Wittenberg college football star, Jack Wheaton, was injured in the Kanton game Oct. 27. His kidney injury requires the rare blood. Hospital pathologists said he is not in danger, but pointed out that he is due for a fourth transfusion, and his case illustrates the need for the hard-to-get AB blood type.

Wittenberg students were canvassed several weeks ago when Wheaton needed his second transfusion, but none of the hundreds of students had the necessary blood type.
