"Love Letters" with Joseph Cotten and Jennifer Jones now at the Ohio theatre is keeping people talking all over the country. The strange story of a girl to whom love letters were written by a man she had never seen but which later caused the death of her husband, the loss of her mind and unhappiness for others. It's truly a magnificent piece of movie production and is one you'll not soon forget.

At the Quilna theatre, don't be surprised if a sudden burst of wind sweeps you out of your seat for it's a "Hurricane" which is being entertained there. "The Hurricane," the story of some islanders who are oppressed by stronger forces than they, but who were saved by the forces of nature—wind, rain and the tides of the ocean. Nobel Award Is Given German

STOCKHOLM, Nov. 17.—(UP)—The 1944 Nobel prize for chemistry has been awarded to German Professor Otto Hahn for important discoveries in atom splitting, the Swedish Academy of Science announced last night.

The 1945 chemistry prize went to Prof. Arturi Virtanen of Helsinki for discovery of new food conservation methods.

Both prizes are worth approximately \$35,000.

Hahn, former head of the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute in Berlin, was believed to be in the United States at present.
