

# "Confidential Agent" At Ohio In Special Show Wednesday

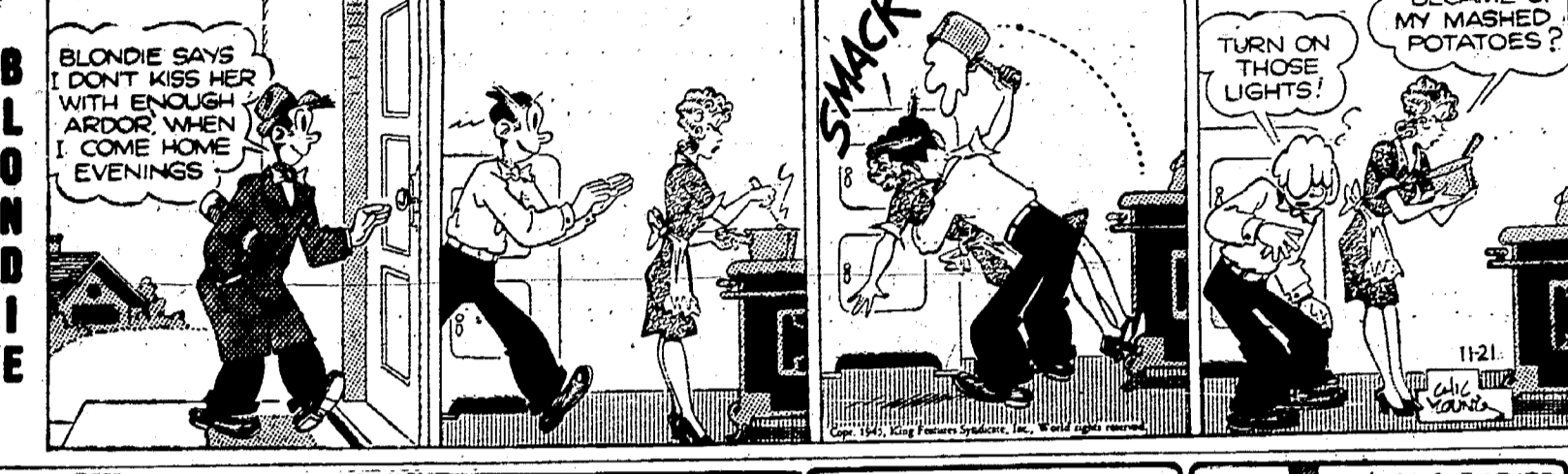
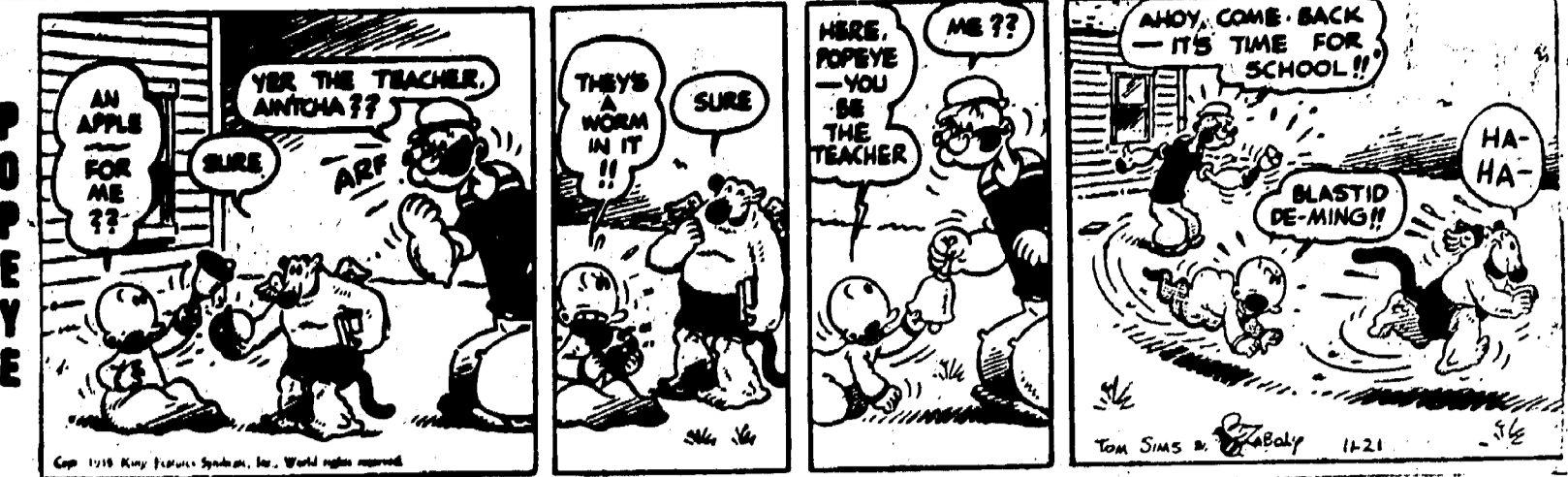
