CRANES OPEN STAND ON ONE LEG. The longest windpipe. This bird's windpipe curves and folds so much that it has a length of from 25 to 30 inches! As we might figure from its name, the whooping crane utters loud sounds or "whoops." These are given out while it is in flight, also while it is on the ground. Central Canada is the favorite nesting place of whooping cranes. They build their nests near water, often beside a small lake. After a rearing their young, whooping cranes fly southward, almost always following the Mississippi valley route. They spend their winters on land around the Gulf of Mexico, chiefly in Florida, Texas and Mexico. Other important cranes on this continent are the sandhill cranes. They have slate-gray feathers. Their wingspread is about six and a half feet, or one foot less than the wingspread of whooping cranes. (For NATURE section of your scrapbook.)
