**Uncle Ray's Corner**

**SMALL HAWKS PURSUE PIGEONS, MOLES, AND MICE**

There are two "birds of prey" which I should like to speak about today. Both belong to the hawk family, and neither is very large. I am thinking of the merlin and the kestrel.

The merlin is a European bird, and looks a great deal like a sparrowhawk of this continent. When full grown, it is only from 10 to 13 inches long.

Merlins are the smallest hawks used in the sport known as "falconry." This sport was popular in the Middle Ages, and to this day there are people who follow it. The idea of it is to send out hawks to capture birds for their masters.

The larger hawks, or falcons, are employed to bring down the more important prey. This peregrine falcon chase such birds as gulls, plovers and curlews.

Merlins have a place in the sport because they are easy to handle. They can be tamed quickly, and they soon learn to go after game for their owners. Pigeons and partridges are captured by these little hawks.

Almost as small as the merlins are the kestrels. Kestrels range in length from 12 to 15 inches.

Kestrels are of little use in the sport of falconry. They will attack small birds, but their instinct leads them to feed chiefly on such furry animals as field mice and moles. They also capture frogs, lizards and insects.

A special name used in Great Britain for the kestrel is "wind-hover." This name grew from the fact that the bird likes to hover in the air while gazing at the ground. Beating its wings fast enough to
