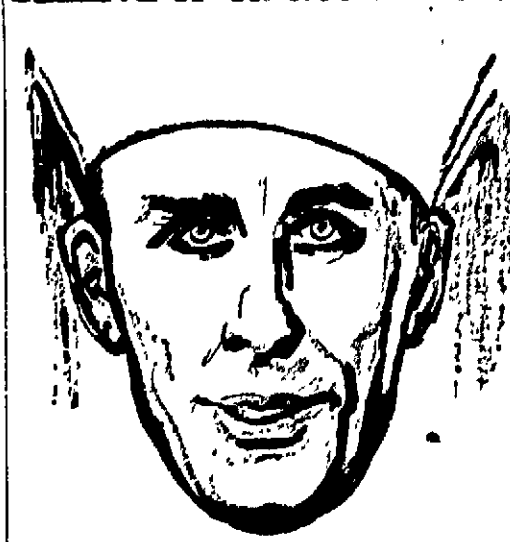

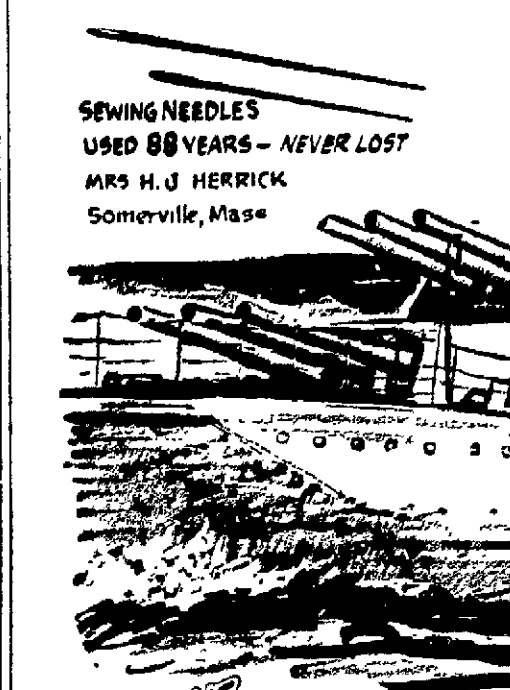

Boston Makes Bid For UNO Home Site

LONDON, Dec. 1 — (UP) — Boston was making its bid to be permanent home of the United Nations today in calm, cultured tones befitting the city's dignified tradition.

A delegation of leading citizens led by Gov. Maurice J. Tobin was concentrating its soft-spoken salesmanship upon British leaders at the UNO preparatory commission.

The British are trying to keep the world headquarters in Europe, but are understood to favor an east coast city in event the headquarters are assigned to the United States.

In the Boston delegation is a leading American atomic bomb researcher, Dr. Karl T. Compton, president of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Tobin said the delegation emphasized the cultural and educational tradition of the city. There are five possible sites in the Boston area, he said, all with beautiful scenery of woodlands and sea.

PORTSMOUTH, Dec. 1—(AP)—The city board of education last night accepted the resignation of W. Dennis Perkinson, superintendent of schools. Board members said Perkinson had requested the release so that he might accept a position with the rehabilitation and education division of the Veterans administration. He had been superintendent since 1941.

Output Of Auto Tires On Increase
WASHINGTON, Dec. 1—(UP)— Production of passenger tires has risen sharply in the past few weeks, but rationing cannot end immediately, the Office of Price Administration and Office of Civilian Production reported today.

The OPA announced that the passenger car tire quota for December will be 2,500,000, the same as in the past six months. It said quotas were announced earlier than usual because of reports that some tire dealers are taking unrationed orders.

OPA said of passenger tire production during this quarter may reach the goal of 11,000,000. It said the industry now has a backlog of 5,000,000 passenger tires compared with a pre-war stock of two to three million more.

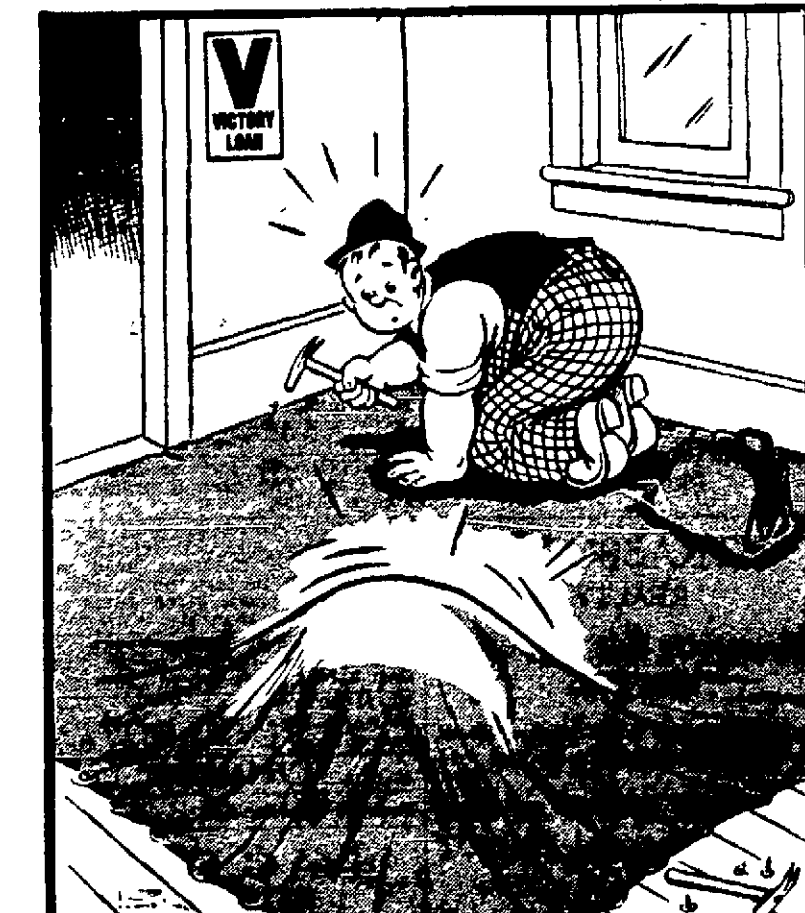

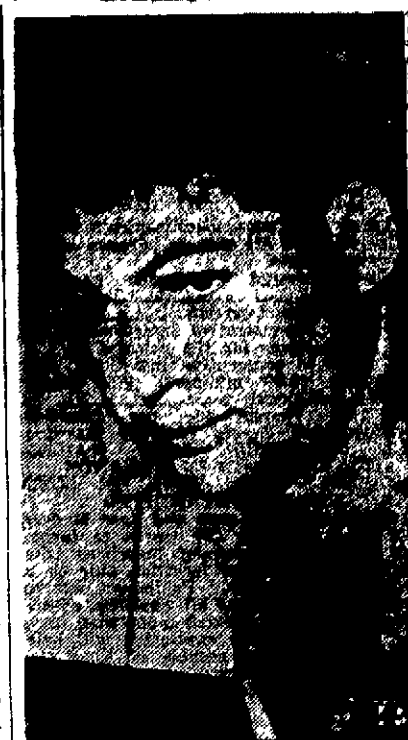
