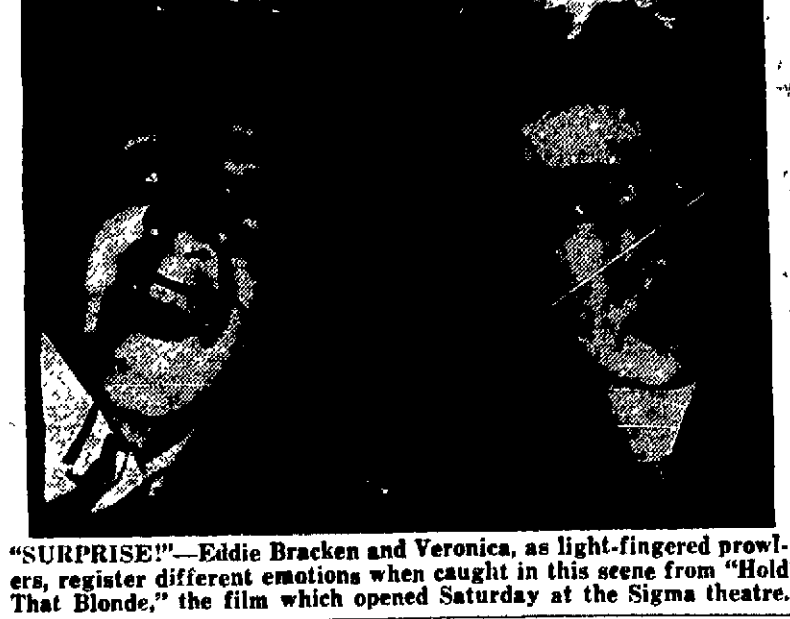
The opening broadcast of "Exploring the Unknown," the new dramatic series illustrating "your stake in science," will focus on "The Lie Detector" at 9 p. m.
