Lausche Declares Victory Loan Week

CLEVELAND, Dec. 3.—(UP)—The Ohio headquarters of the victory bond loan announced today that Gov. Frank J. Lausche had proclaimed this week, Dec. 2 to Dec. 8, as victory loan week and called on all citizens to purchase an additional bond and volunteer workers to redouble their efforts during the final week of solicitation.

The governor's proclamation was made as the result of lagging individual bond sales, which have fallen behind established goals.

The victory bond office announced that the state's E-bond sales thru Nov. 20 amounted to \$51,525,048, 43.30 per cent of the quota; and individual bond sales totaled \$211,825,569 or 92.50 per cent of quota.

Livestock Exhibit Has Record Entries

CHICAGO, Dec. 3.—(UP)—The fourth annual Chicago market fat stock show opened at Union Stockyards Saturday with the largest number of entries ever listed for the show.

A total of 5,488 purebred cattle, sheep and hogs were entered in the show, substituted during the war for the international live stock exposition. It will be the last streamlined show. Plans already are underway for a full-scale exposition in 1946.

Last year's entries in the show numbered approximately 5,400, of which approximately 700 steers were entered by farm boys and girls. The youngsters have entered nearly 1,000 head more than last year.

The Union Stock Yards and Transit Company, sponsor of the show, announced that as heretofore office of price administration ceiling prices would be lifted for the auction sale of the junior entries.

Emory S. Green, Cleveland lawyer, obtained nominating petitions for the office of U. S. senator but did not indicate whether he planned to seek the long or short term. Green is a Republican.

Future Of German Movie Films Studied

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3.—(UP)—Alien Property Custodian James E. Markham today pondered whether to release 1,150 German movie films which Rep. Ellis Patterson, D. Calif., says are "full of free love, the Hitler youth movement and Prussianism."

Last June Markham tried to get the pictures off his hands. He announced that license rights would be offered for public bid. Various people said that Nazi propaganda was being turned loose in the land.

Patterson said the films were Hitler propaganda.

Rep. Helen Cahagan Douglas, D. Calif., said the pictures portrayed the Germans as nice people when they had devastated Europe.

But Roger N. Baldwin, director of the American Civil Liberties Union, said that suppression of the films constituted censorship by a government agency.
