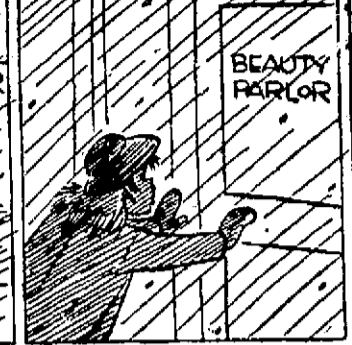

Uncle Ray's Corner

Greenland Eskimos Use Stone-and-Turf Houses
A suggestion has been made lately that the United States should buy the island of Greenland. If this purchase took place, it would mean that more land would be transferred than when Alaska was bought from Russia. Alaska contains 580,884 square miles. It was bought in 1867 while William H. Seward was the American secretary of state. People spoke of the purchase as "Seward's folly," and called Alaska "Seward's icebox." One man said that the United States had bought "590,000 square miles of icebergs and polar bears."
Most persons nowadays think it was wise for the United States to buy Alaska. The value of the gold mined there is far greater than the purchase price.
As far as "iceboxes" go, Greenland is even more frozen than Alaska. Most of the island is covered with snow and ice.
So far as can be seen today, Greenland has little value except for two things — defense and weather forecasting. The island lies across a short air pathway between Europe and North America, and it offers places for Arctic weather stations.
Greenland is the world's largest island, not counting Australia.

as an island. Its area is almost one-fourth as great as that of Canada, and it is a little more than one-fourth the size of the United States.
Greenland is a colony of Denmark, one of the small nations of Europe. Some years before the outbreak of the second world war, the population was given as 16,930. This was an average of only one person in 49 square miles. Most of the people live in a few settlements along the southern coasts.
The great majority of Greenland's inhabitants are Eskimos. When the last census was taken, only 274 Danes lived there.
