As a mild-mannered doorman in love with a beautiful model, radio actor Larry Haines trades thrills for chills when he appears as guest ghoul behind your Host Paul McGrath's creaking door in "Puppet For Murder," a blood-letting "Inner Sanctum" mystery to be aired at 9 p. m. Tuesday over CBS.

Even an apartment house doorman should know better than to meddle in a situation where a married man plans to clope with a gold-digging beauty, and this poor guy roots out plenty of trouble for himself when murder is committed.
