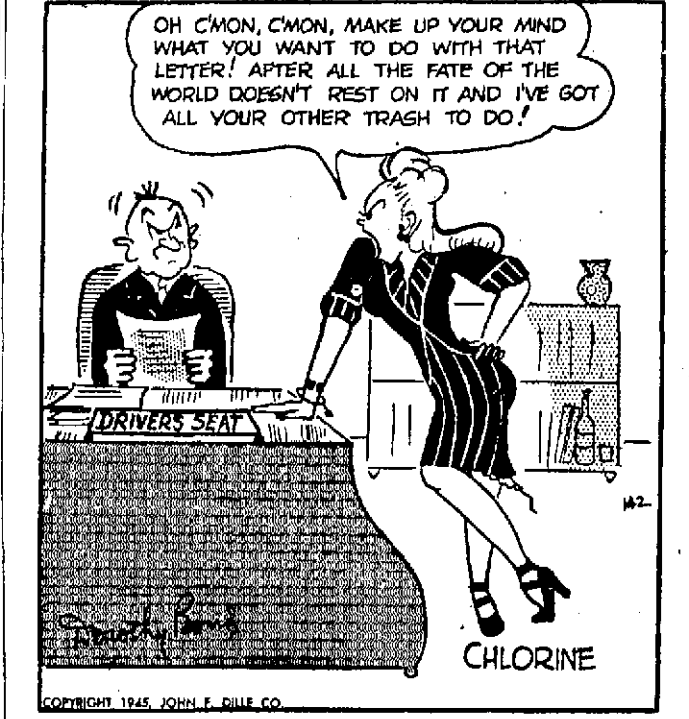

of Europe. They had learned about the excellent fishing off the Newfoundland coast. The fishermen had special reasons to go ashore. Not wishing to stay on their sailing vessels all the time, they could have firm footing while they camped along the coast. Another reason was the fact that the sailors had to salt and dry their fish. This they were able to do better while ashore than aboard their vessels. Great Britain gained control over Newfoundland, but the island was under a strange form of government during the two centuries after its discovery. This was known as the "fishing admirals" government. Each year the captain of one of the fishing vessels was chosen to serve as "the boss," or "fishing admiral," of the whole fleet during the so-

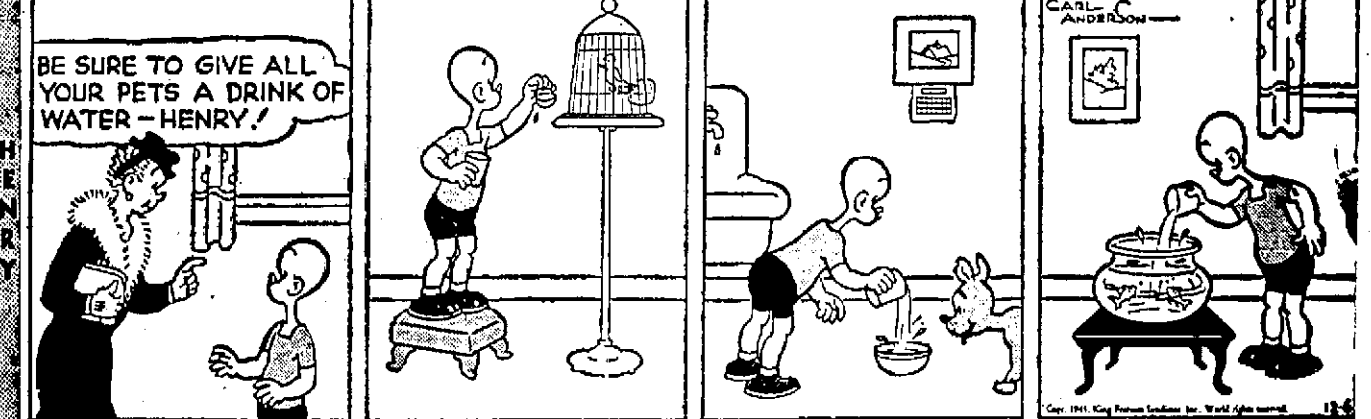
Burke Church Plans Dinner Saturday

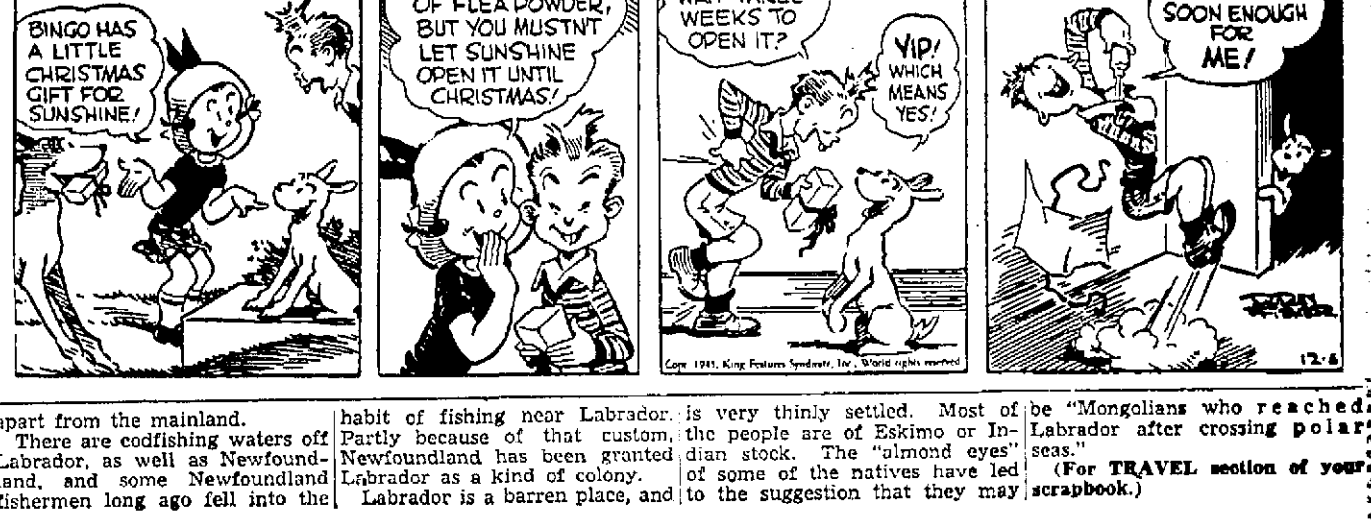

Records tell us that Newfoundland was the home of only 350 families in the year 1650.
