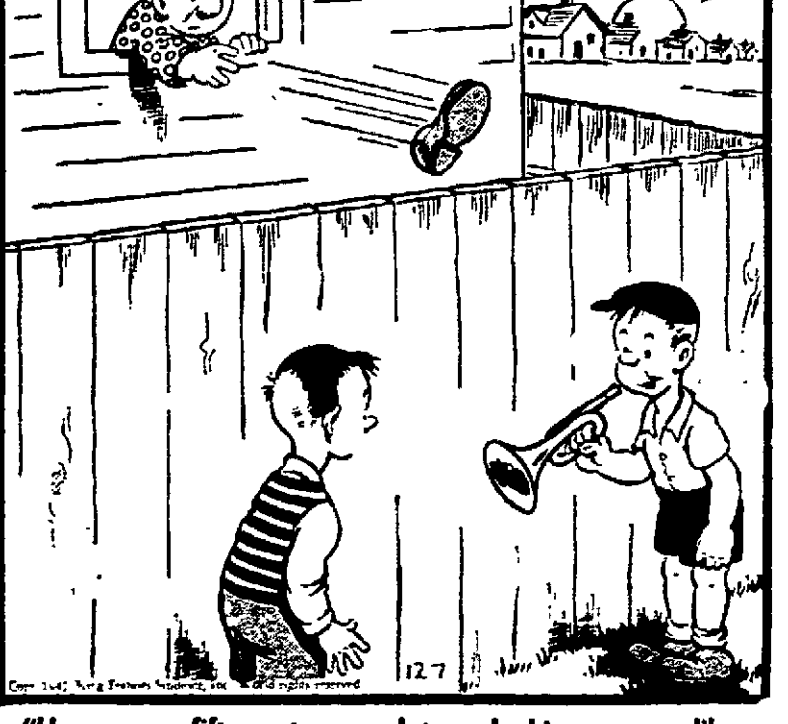

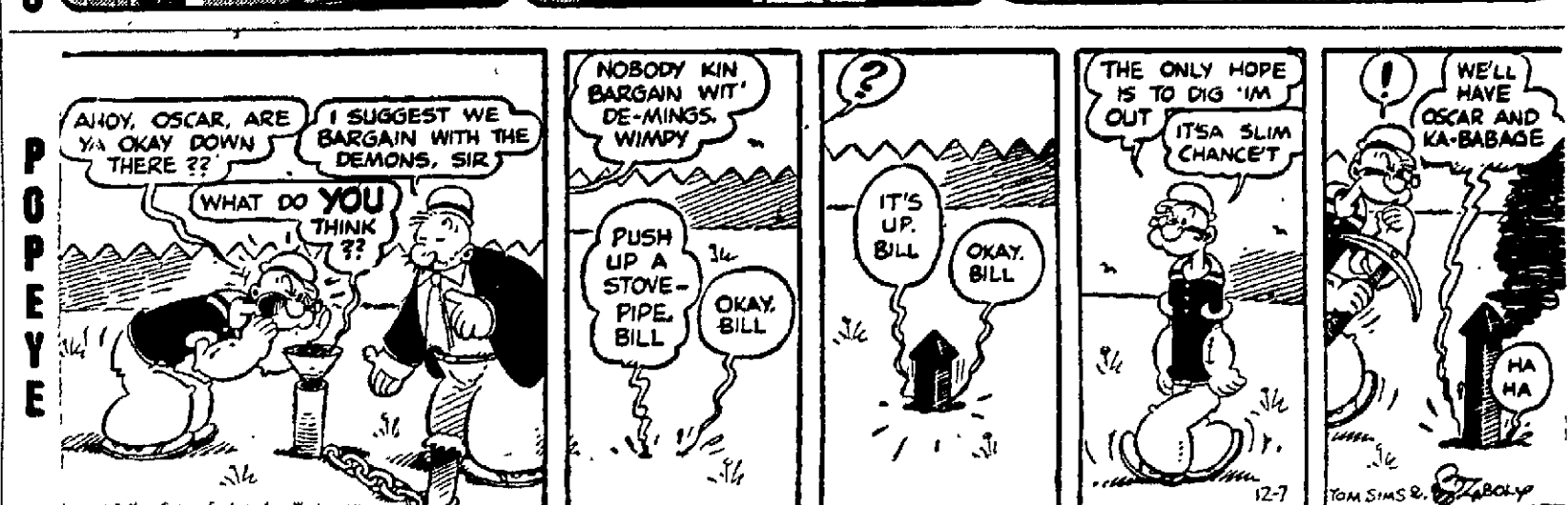
**Governor To Share Mansion With Vets**

**EDITOR.** The Lima News—Under heading, "Ohio Political News," in Sunday's Lima News, Mr. H. H. Daugherty says, "State Auditor Joseph T. (Little Joe) Ferguson may have found his 'baked potato' this week after nine years diligent search. Ferguson's refusal to approve expenses of a committee to San Francisco to welcome home Major Gen. Robert S. Beightler, commander of Ohio's 37th National Guard Division from the Pacific wars, may put him in the class with former Gov. V. Donahay and his famous baked potato incident.

"We didn't send a reception committee to welcome the privates back from the battlefields of Europe and the Pacific and I don't see why we should now send one to welcome the generals. Anyway such an expenditure would be illegal!" Such was a paraphrase of Ferguson's dictum which blocked plans for sending the reception committee to the west coast. No one, not even Gov. Frank J. Lausche, who appointed the committee, could muster sufficient fortitude to buck Ferguson. They seemed to agree he probably was right.

Mr. Daugherty goes on to explain in five inches of a column about the famous Donahay 30 cent baked potato, which he cut from a judge's expense account, while he was state auditor. Mr. Daugherty states "that many people believe that Donahay's action was a political move to secure votes," and that idea may have passed

that (Little Joe) Ferguson thought that thousands of dollars of taxpayers' money should not be spent to boost the political stock of any gubernatorial candidate, either Democratic or Republican, so long as the average old age pension in Ohio is \$29 per month? If the men who wanted this money spent on this reception committee should have to live for one year on this average old age pension, \$10 will get you \$20, that you'd never hear a peep out of them again about a greeting committee meeting anyone. Just what (Little Joe's) reasons were, other than the valid ones he gave, I would not know.
