Wapak Discusses Parking Meters

WAPAKONETA, Dec. 8.—City council discussed the advantages of parking meters in Wapakoneta last night in their next to final meeting of the year.

New council members who will convene the first Wednesday in January will probably continue the discussion. Mayor-elect Walter Harrod pointed out to his present council contemporaries that Bellefontaine which installed 150 meters is receiving more than \$17,000 a year revenue.

Also suggested for Wapakoneta is the employment of a city engineer. Heretofore problems of city engineering were handled by the county engineer.

Union Turns Down GM Salary Offer

NEW YORK, Dec. 8 (AP)—An offer by General Motors Corp. for a 13 1/2 cent-an-hour pay increase for 30,000 workers in three Ohio cities and Rochester, N. Y., has been rejected by the CIO United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers.

The union, which will conduct a strike vote among 270,000 workers in General Motors, General Electric Co. and Westinghouse Co. next Thursday, is seeking a wage boost of approximately 25 cents an hour.

The three Ohio plants involved are the Frigidaire division and Delco Products division, Dayton; Packard Electric division, Warren; and Delco-Remy Antioch foundry, Yellow Springs. The Rochester plant in the Delco Products division.

Neil Brant, international representative of the union, said the union's executive board by almost unanimous action had found the offer not acceptable. He said negotiations would continue.

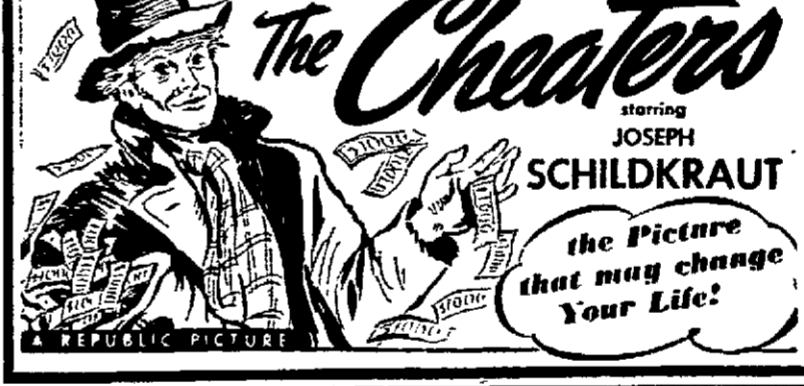
