

# Tom Sawyer Film Bows In At Quilna Theatre Friday

The immortal Tom Sawyer created by Mark Twain, and beloved by millions the world over, has been brought to life again on the screen of the Quilna theatre in the form of "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer." Bringing back in full color boyhood days which, in passing seem insignificant until later years, Tom Sawyer depicts the real American boy, his actions, pranks, goodness and badness. Packed with hilarity and adventure from beginning to end, the picture is a tribute to Mark Twain, the author of the book.

COLUMBUS, Dec. 14—(AP)—Dates for the 1946 Ohio State fair—the first in five years—will be Aug. 24-30.

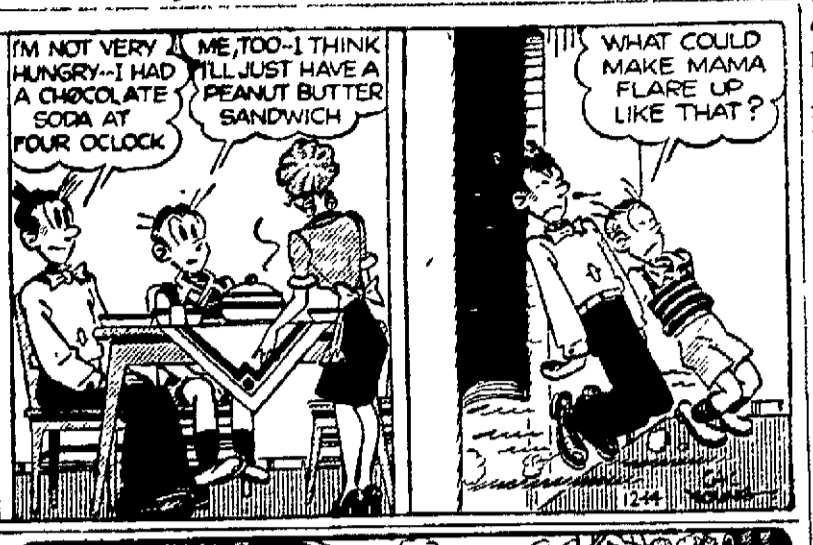
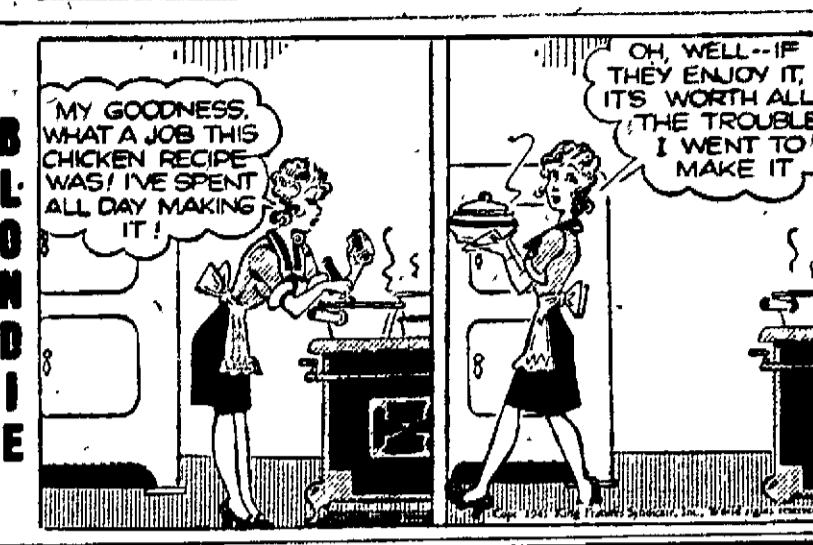

DELPHOS, Dec. 14—A meeting of the Board of Education and health commissioner Dr. J. N. Sadler is slated for Friday night when a survey of the flu epidemic here will be made to board members.
