

Daltons On Rampage In Film On Sigma Screen

The Daltons are on the rampage again. Yes, they have been revived to bring another chapter of their notorious lives to the screen of the Sigma theatre opening Wednesday.

The rugged picture focuses attention upon the final Dalton foray, the Coffeyville, Kans. raid in 1892, when the fearsome foursome was all but liquidated. These notorious brigands who terrorized Kansas settlers—in fact nearly petrified them with fear every time news got around that the Daltons were heading that way. Emmett, played by Alan Curtis, is tied for his life, following this raid. He discloses then that he and his brothers had abandoned banditry and were battling for justice against the Kansas land-grabbers, when tricked into the Coffeyville ambush and their doom.

The Ohio theatre has "Lady On a Train" with Deanna Durbin, and folks seem to be liking it. The picture, which folks had been expecting, hoping and praying for arrived Friday and ever since has been playing to capacity audiences.

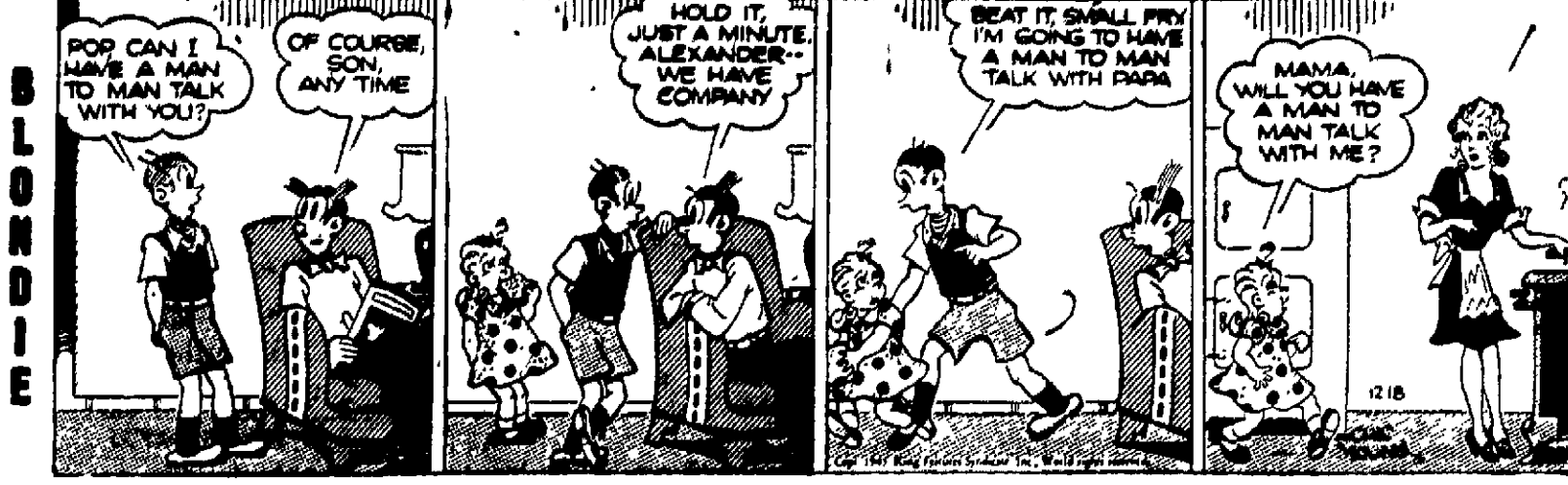

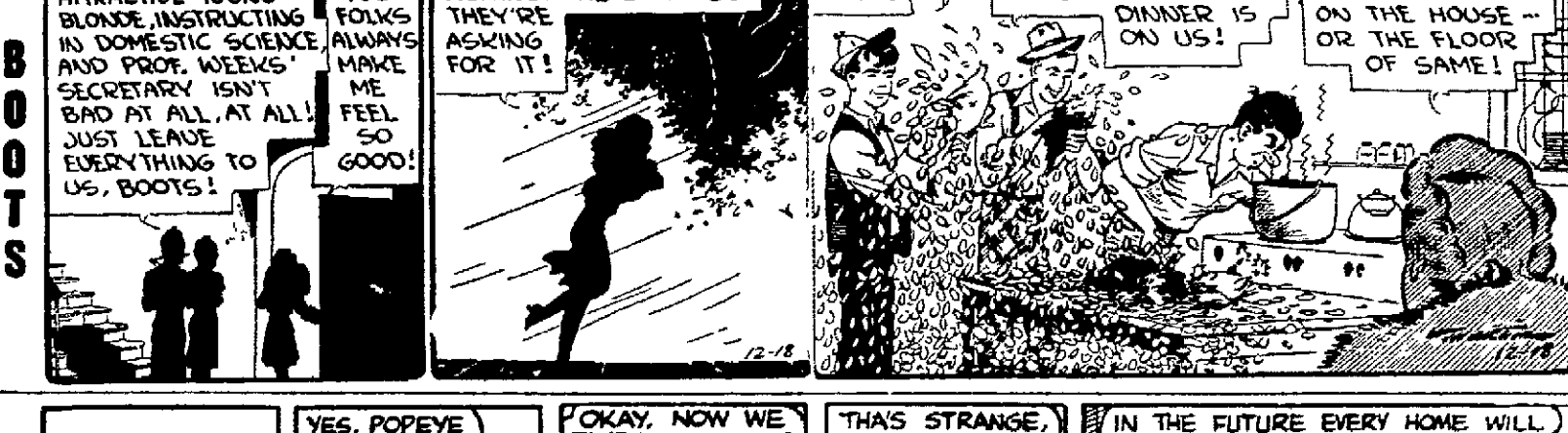

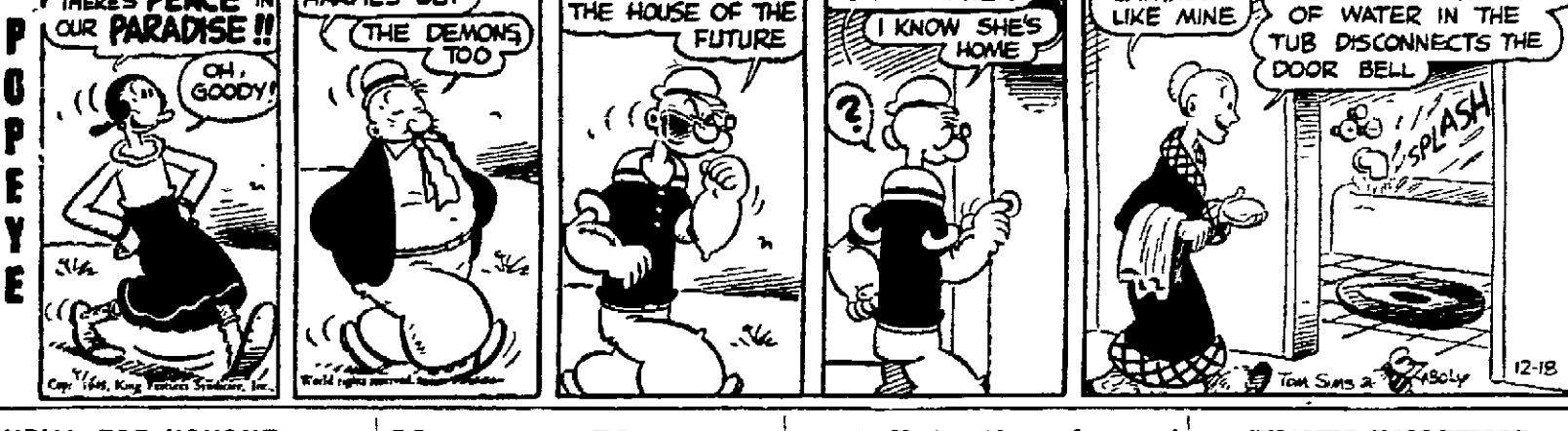
