Former Leader Of GOP Is Dead

CLEVELAND, Dec. 19—(UP)—Joseph R. Nutt, 76, treasurer of the Republican National committee from 1928 until 1933 and president of the old Cleveland Union Trust Co., died Tuesday after an illness of two days.

Nutt had engaged in his own investment business and maintained directorships in the Nickel Plate railroad and the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co. since the Union Trust Co., which he helped expand from a small company in 1901, folded during the bank holiday of 1933.
